The over-all renovation program is really beginning to add to the appearance and driving pleasure of motorists of Eastland Streets, most agree.

## All-Inclusive Campaign Is UF President's Goal

Eastland United Fund President Mrs. C. W. (Ann) Hoffmann Jr. is busy with pre-campaign planning and it appears that the UF drive in Eastland will be "turned on" in fine style this year.

She's been attending workshops and is working hard putting into practice the ideas picked up from other successful UF efforts.

However, one of her projects may face opposition before it comes to be a fact of life. It is Mrs. Hoffmann's goal to see all Fund-raising drives in Eastland consolidated into one major effort, that being the United Fund.

Traditionally, there are some agencies which do not prefer to be a part of United Fund or any other joint drive, reasoning that not only do they collect more funds in separate campaigns of their own, they also have the opportunity through their own drives to distribute pamphlets and other literature which helps them educate the public, as their various cause, as well as collect funds.

Among those agencies which have separate drives in Eastland are the Cancer Society, the March of Dimes, the Heart Association, Easter Seal and Muscular Dystrophy.

Mrs. Hoffmann feels strongly about the matter and plans to make it a major topic at the UF's board of director's meeting, Monday, Aug. 21, at the Texas Electric Service Co. Reddy Room, beginning at 3 p.m.

Her position is that one, well-published drive can accomplish the same thing as a series of small drives. She cites these towns which have such ordinances as examples: The City Commission also meets on Monday, Aug. 21, at 7 p.m. at City Hall, and Mrs. Hoffmann hopes to carry her board's approval to the city meeting at which time she'll ask for a city ordinance which, if passed, would prevent any other, but a United Fund drive in the city.

She stated this week that Mayor Frank Deaton is in sympathy with her plan, as is City Manager Lewis Tiner and Commissioner James Reid. She explained her plan this week, and intends to have a local attorney draft a suitable ordinance for the city commission consideration.

It passed by the city on the 21st, letters would go out to the UF Sec-Treasurer James Reid to all agencies asking them to join the United Fund and share in the over-all publicity, and all-out one-drive effort.

All agencies will be asked to appear before a screening committee on Tuesday, Sept. 5, between 10 a.m. and noon, for the purpose of making their proposals and asking the amounts needed, she said.

The local UF budget, goals and campaign dates will be set at the board meeting she said.

Dale Bakker is campaign chairman for this year's drive and J. T. (Buddy) Carter is UF vice-president.

Holdover directors are Marlene Johnson, Charles Freyschlag, Jay Staggs, Mike Collins, Obie Duncan, Mrs. Floyd Robertson, Dick Dixon, and Frank Sayre.

New directors are Dale Bakker, H. V. O'Brien, Darwin Miller, James Glenn, Herb Weaver, Veon Howard, Ralph Sittler and Dick Ray.

Mike was an outstanding student in several capacities academically, as a member of the EHS Maverick band, and as an Eagle Scout.

He is a nephew of Mrs. Maude Dabney of Eastland.

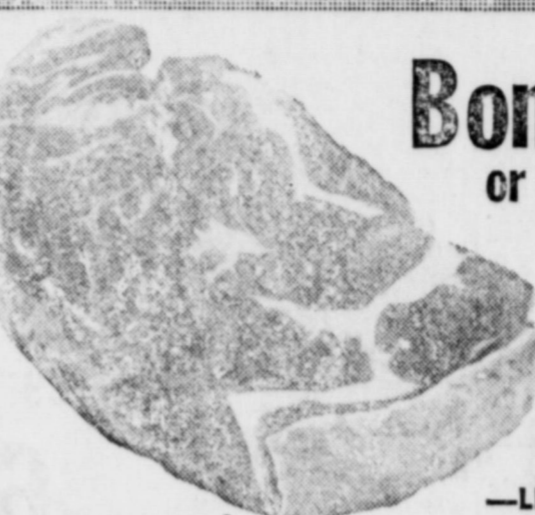

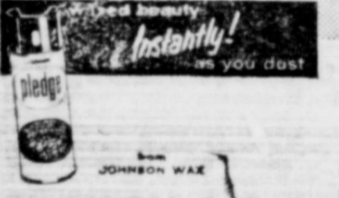
