## County Naive Buried Sunday At Desdemona

Funeral services were held at 3 p. m. Sunday at the First Baptist Church in Desdemona for Benjamin Franklin Fonville, Sr., 67, a life-long resident of Eastland County. He died at 3 p. m. Friday in a Weatherford hospital after a brief illness.

Burial was in the Howard Cemetery near Gorman. Directing the services was the Rev. Robert R. Jeffrey, pastor of the Desdemona church.

Mr. Fonville, a retired farmer and rancher, was born August 20, 1900, in Eastland County. He was a long-time member of the First Baptist Church in Desdemona.

Survivors include his wife, Ethel; one son, B. F. Jr. of Garland; two daughters, Mrs. Bob Horton of Weatherford and Mrs. D. L. Hughes of Fort Worth; three brothers, Sam of Desdemona, Jess of Stephenville and Joe of Ranger; one sister, Mrs. R. L. Slaughter of Cisco; 8 grandchildren.

## SIGNED ORDER ARRIVES -INJUNCTION GRANTED

The official, signed order, granting a temporary injunction to keep Truman Kirk's name off the May 4 Democratic Primary, was received in Eastland Wednesday morning and was being filed in 91st District Court.

The order, signed by Judge E. H. Griffin and dated Mar. 15, arrived in an envelope postmarked "Breckenridge, March 16," was received by Attorney Virgil T. Seaberry Jr. Wednesday, March 20.

A personal letter to attorneys in the case was received last week from Judge Griffin, but much speculation has been made in the county by some over the fact that the official order had not been received.

Another item of business at the Eastland County Democratic Convention was a letter of resolution to Cong. Omar Burleson, asking that in making federal appointments in the county that he work through the Democratic committee.

## Two Persons Killed In Auto Accident

A rain-slick highway resulted in the death of two persons on Highway 80 in Ranger Monday morning. The accident occurred at 10:45 a. m.

Killed in the accident was Mrs. Cora Asposito Caldwell, 52, of 909 Zeldia Dr., Hurst, Texas. Pronounced dead on arrival at the Ranger General Hospital was Clyde Douglas Caldwell, 43, also of Hurst. Injured in the accident was Allan P. Michaelson, 34, 4928 Forrest Bend, Dallas.

Mrs. Caldwell was reported to be driving a 195 Ford. A witness said that the Ford went into a spin in the rain-slick highway and spun for 40 to 50 feet before hitting the 1968 Buick, driven by Michaelson.

The two men were taken to the Ranger General Hospital by a Killingsworth ambulance. Police Chief J. W. Vinson investigated the accident.

## Two Juveniles Are Sentenced In Auto Theft

A Cisco boy, 15, was remanded to custody of the state Youth Council and directed to be taken to Gatesville, and a Putnam boy, 16, was turned over to the custody of his parents after appearing before County Judge Scott Bailey Monday in a hearing on a recent car theft in Cisco.

The Putnam lad was advised to make application for the Job Corps, Judge Bailey said.

Judge Bailey entered an order which will permit Cisco residents who lost merchandise and belongings in recent burglaries to claim their belongings from local law enforcement agencies.

The items were being held as possible evidence in the event that the case went before a grand jury.

## City Increases Contribution To Library

The Eastland City Commission transacted quite a bit of business during a regular night at City Hall.

With Mayor Frank Deaton and all commissioners, the commission:

Approved an ordinance authorizing Mayor Deaton to execute a maintenance agreement with Texas State Highway Department to maintain Highway 6 and Highway 80 within the City limits of the City, and spelling out the responsibility of the Texas State Highway Department and the City regarding that maintenance.

Authorized City Manager Lewis Tiner to accept bids on a new car for the police department.

Authorized the mayor to execute a quit claim deed to the West 50 feet of Lots 2 & 4 Block 18, Daugherty Addition to the City of Eastland, in favor of H. R. Casey.

Raised the City of Eastland's contribution to the Library to \$600 for the year 1968. In previous years the City has contributed \$500 a year.

Authorized the purchase of a piece of used equipment to be used in the street department provided the offering price of the equipment proves to be fair on inspection.

## Truman Snell Is Injured in Wreck Near Carbon

Truman Dwayne Snell of Carbon was admitted to Eastland Memorial Hospital Tuesday evening about 7:30 p. m. following a one-car accident a mile south of Carbon. Snell was taken to the hospital by an Arrington Hamner Funeral Home ambulance.

The 1966 Buick driven by Snell slid on wet pavement, struck a telephone pole, pulled down some ten feet of fence, and landed in a sand field about 80 yards from the highway, according to investigating officer Ken Perry of Eastland. Perry stated that the car body separated from the frame and car parts were scattered over a large area.

Snell was thrown from the car. He suffered lacerations on the back and head, Perry stated.

## Over 34,000 Vehicles In Area Still Need Inspection Sticker

Patrolman Carl Boustead reported today that more than 34,000 vehicles still remain to be inspected in his area for the official 1968 inspection sticker before April 1.

Patrolman Boustead's area includes Eastland, Shackelford, Callahan, Stephens and Brown Counties. This area has 50,245 registered vehicles and only 32 per cent have been inspected.

Patrolman Boustead reminded vehicle owners that under new provisions of the inspection law, the inspection will include front seat belts in cars where the anchorages are part of the manufacturer's original equipment. Also under the new provisions the steering, wheels and rims will be inspected.

Those motorists who wait until the last weeks of the inspection period to have their cars inspected may find that they will need to install seat belts, and with the last minute rush, the supply of available seat belt kits may not take care of the demand. Dealers will have no way of knowing how many sets to have on hand, so to be on the safe side we urge all owners to have the work done as soon as possible.

Motor Vehicle Inspection Patrolman urge motorists to have their vehicles inspected early in order to avoid the

long lines which will develop as the inspection deadline of April 15 draws near.

A person may have his vehicle inspected at any of the 5,336 inspection stations in Texas. Each authorized station displays a standard sign identifying the establishment as one approved by the State for conducting inspections.

The cost of the inspection this year is \$1.75. Any repairs or adjustments needed on the vehicle will be extra.

## Fire Insurance Rate Cuts Seen

State Board of Insurance proposed its first cuts in seven years (average of 3.6 per cent) in statewide fire, extended coverage and home owners insurance premiums.

Rate experts suggested 4.4 per cent reduction in fire premiums, 3 per cent in extended coverage and 3.1 per cent average for home owners.

Fire and extended coverage rates are set statewide, and homeowners rates are figured on a three-region basis due to weather hazards.

If adopted, rates would be effective June 1. Biggest money saving on home owners' premiums would be in 10-county Sherman area where rates are now high.

## Record Number Of Tourists Visit State Last Year

AUSTIN — Texas last year hosted more visitors — who spent more money here — than ever before, the Texas Highway Department reported today.

A total of 20,684,000 persons from out of the State visited Texas in 1967. They spent a record \$1,203,137,000, making 1967 the second year in a row that the value of the Texas travel industry has surpassed the billion-dollar mark.

The automobile again was the favorite mode of transportation.

The Highway Department's annual visitor industry survey showed 15,198,000 persons visited Texas by automobile during the year. Their expenditures in the State amounted to a total of \$807,972,000 while in the State. Total number of automobile visitors was up 7.4 per cent over 1966, and their expenditures rose 11.6 per cent.

In addition, the Texas Tourist Council, an Austin-based association of travel-related businesses, estimated that an additional 5,486,000 out-of-state visitors came to Texas by commercial carriers. This group added an estimated \$395,165,000 to the State's economy.

The Highway Department's survey of automobile travelers employed visual and mechanical traffic count sur-

veys. Valuable data gained from five thousand questionnaires distributed by the Tourist Information returned by our Texas visitors.

The school will be co-sponsored by the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association and the Cisco Chamber of Commerce. The morning session of the school will begin at 9:30 a.m. in the new auditorium of Cisco Junior College. This session will be devoted to discussions and demonstrations on budding and grafting. After lunch the afternoon session will be held at the B. T. Graham orchard, one mile west of town on the old Abilene Highway. Field demonstrations will be given and everyone will have an opportunity to practice the patch bud and inlay graft techniques.

Dr. J. W. Worthington, Texas A&M Extension Service Horticulturist, and Gordon will assist with the demonstrations.

Anton White, President of the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association, said the date of the school was set March 4 in a business meeting of the association. Other events and dates set during the meeting was the spring field day in the Cisco area May 24, and the fall pecan tour September 13 in the Rising Star area.

Everyone is welcome to attend the school. In the past 14 years over 1,500 men and women from central and west Texas have attended the school and learned to propagate pecans.

### Over 34,000 Vehicles In Area Still Need Inspection Sticker

Patrolman Carl Boustead reported today that more than 34,000 vehicles still remain to be inspected in his area for the official 1968 inspection sticker before April 1.

Patrolman Boustead's area includes Eastland, Shackelford, Callahan, Stephens and Brown Counties. This area has 50,245 registered vehicles and only 32 per cent have been inspected.

Patrolman Boustead reminded vehicle owners that under new provisions of the inspection law, the inspection will include front seat belts in cars where the anchorages are part of the manufacturer's original equipment. Also under the new provisions the steering, wheels and rims will be inspected.

Those motorists who wait until the last weeks of the inspection period to have their cars inspected may find that they will need to install seat belts, and with the last minute rush, the supply of available seat belt kits may not take care of the demand.

Dealers will have no way of knowing how many sets to have on hand, so to be on the safe side we urge all owners to have the work done as soon as possible.

### Record Number Of Tourists Visit State Last Year

AUSTIN — Texas last year hosted more visitors — who spent more money here — than ever before, the Texas Highway Department reported today.

A total of 20,684,000 persons from out of the State visited Texas in 1967. They spent a record \$1,203,137,000, making 1967 the second year in a row that the value of the Texas travel industry has surpassed the billion-dollar mark.

The automobile again was the favorite mode of transportation. The Highway Department's annual visitor industry survey showed 15,198,000 persons visited Texas by automobile during the year. Their expenditures in the State amounted to a total of \$807,972,000 while in the State. Total number of automobile visitors was up 7.4 per cent over 1966, and their expenditures rose 11.6 per cent.

In addition, the Texas Tourist Council, an Austin-based association of travel-related businesses, estimated that an additional 5,486,000 out-of-state visitors came to Texas by commercial carriers. This group added an estimated \$395,165,000 to the State's economy.

### Fire Insurance Rate Cuts Seen

State Board of Insurance proposed its first cuts in seven years (average of 3.6 per cent) in statewide fire, extended coverage and home owners insurance premiums.

Rate experts suggested 4.4 per cent reduction in fire premiums, 3 per cent in extended coverage and 3.1 per cent average for home owners.

Fire and extended coverage rates are set statewide, and homeowners rates are figured on a three-region basis due to weather hazards.

If adopted, rates would be effective June 1. Biggest money saving on home owners' premiums would be in 10-county Sherman area where rates are now high.

### Pecan School April 19, Cisco

The 15th Annual Eastland County Pecan Budding and Grafting School will be held at Cisco, April 19th according to an announcement today by DeMarquis Gordon, County Agricultural Agent.

The school will be co-sponsored by the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association and the Cisco Chamber of Commerce. The morning session of the school will begin at 9:30 a.m. in the new auditorium of Cisco Junior College. This session will be devoted to discussions and demonstrations on budding and grafting. After lunch the afternoon session will be held at the B. T. Graham orchard, one mile west of town on the old Abilene Highway. Field demonstrations will be given and everyone will have an opportunity to practice the patch bud and inlay graft techniques.

Dr. J. W. Worthington, Texas A&M Extension Service Horticulturist, and Gordon will assist with the demonstrations. Anton White, President of the Eastland County Pecan Growers Association, said the date of the school was set March 4 in a business meeting of the association. Other events and dates set during the meeting was the spring field day in the Cisco area May 24, and the fall pecan tour September 13 in the Rising Star area.

Everyone is welcome to attend the school. In the past 14 years over 1,500 men and women from central and west Texas have attended the school and learned to propagate pecans.

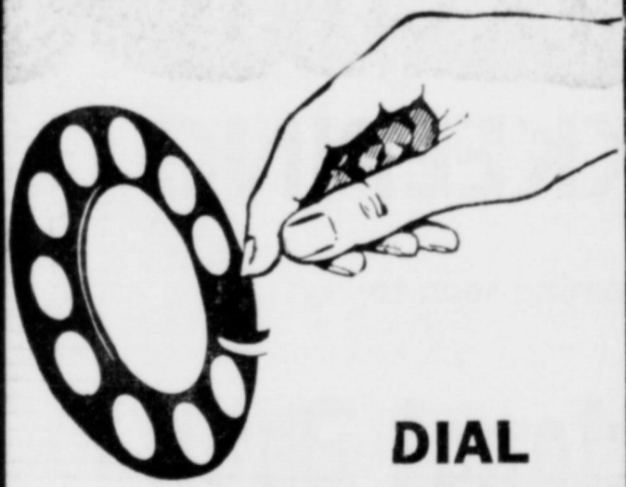

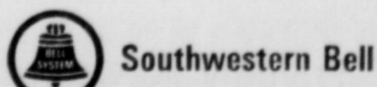
