**AFFIRMED IN PART AND IN PART DISMISSED**

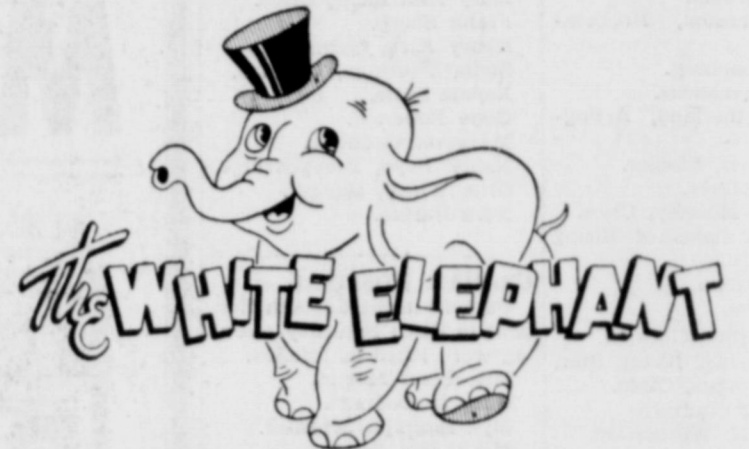

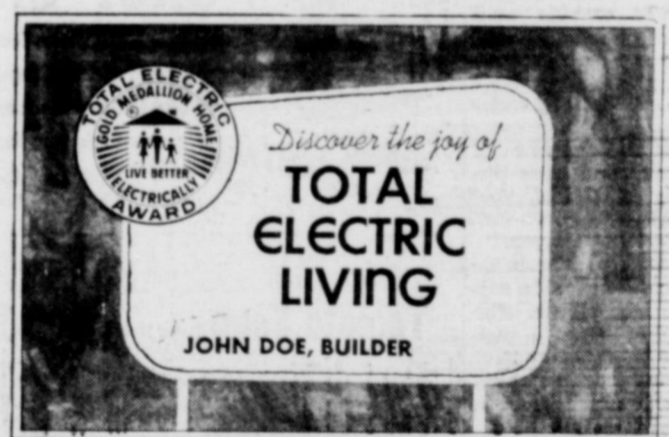
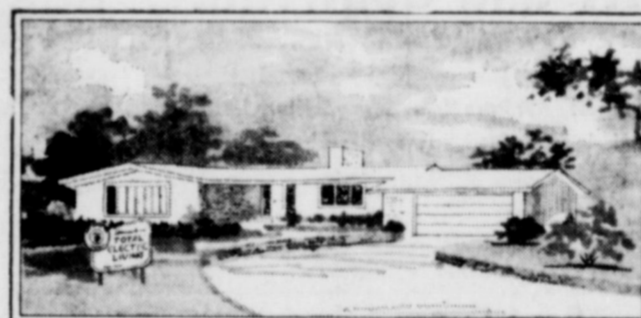
