Special Days Ahead -- Memorial, Flag, July 4

PATRIOTISM IS ALIVE — AND DOING WELL IN EASTLAND (to borrow a phrase from the National Guard).

With three major patriotic days coming up, many arrangements are underway here to offer plenty of opportunities for local citizens to show their colors.

Active planning is underway for Memorial Day, (on May 30), Flag Day (June 14) and July 4 events here.

Officials from Fort Walters are due in Eastland Friday to plan with Ben McKinnis, Chamber of Commerce Special Events Chairman, and Mrs. Marene Johnson, coordinator, for the Flag Day event at the Post Office. The Army Band, foreign students and dignitaries will be here for the annual event.

Post Commander John Morren of the VFW is scheduling special Memorial Day Services at the Cemetery in a tribute to deceased servicemen and women. Present plans call for the formal ceremony, placement of flags and white crosses, as well as other details to be announced.

Plans are developing for the annual July 4th Wild West Show at the Kendrick Amphitheater, with meetings already being held to stage the gigantic event.

Some 23 foreign students at Fort Walters will be here for Flag Day, and the Fort will send their United Nations flags for the event. It's to be a special "camera day" with a lot of color material available for the photo enthusiasts. Color post cards of the Post Office's Stamp Mural Window are now available in Eastland at Central Drug, Eastland Drug and the White Elephant Restaurant.

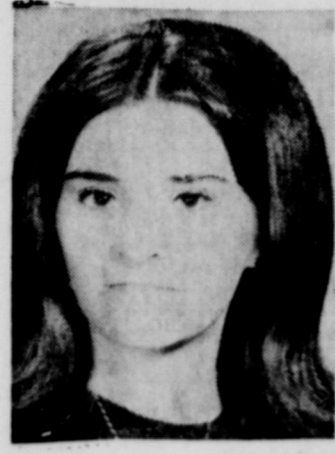
Survivors include his wife, Flossie; one sister, Mollie White of Freeport; and one brother, Munson McFadden of Midland.

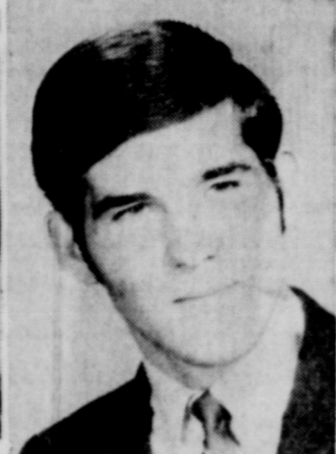

Tornado Watch System in Effect For Eastland

A "Tornado-Watch" system in cooperation with the U. S. Weather Bureau was put into effect in Eastland this week.

Under the plan, Bureau Observer James Dabney will be notified by the Weather Bureau of a tornado alert (as he was on three days last week), and he will in turn notify Mr. G. B. Wilcoxon who will station three other radio-equipped observers at strategic points around the city to actually watch for possible funnel clouds.

In the event a funnel is sighted by one of these qualified and responsible observers, the word will be passed by radio to the City Fire Department where Siren warnings will be given.

The program is part of the Weather Bureau's "tornado alley" Sky-Warn program.

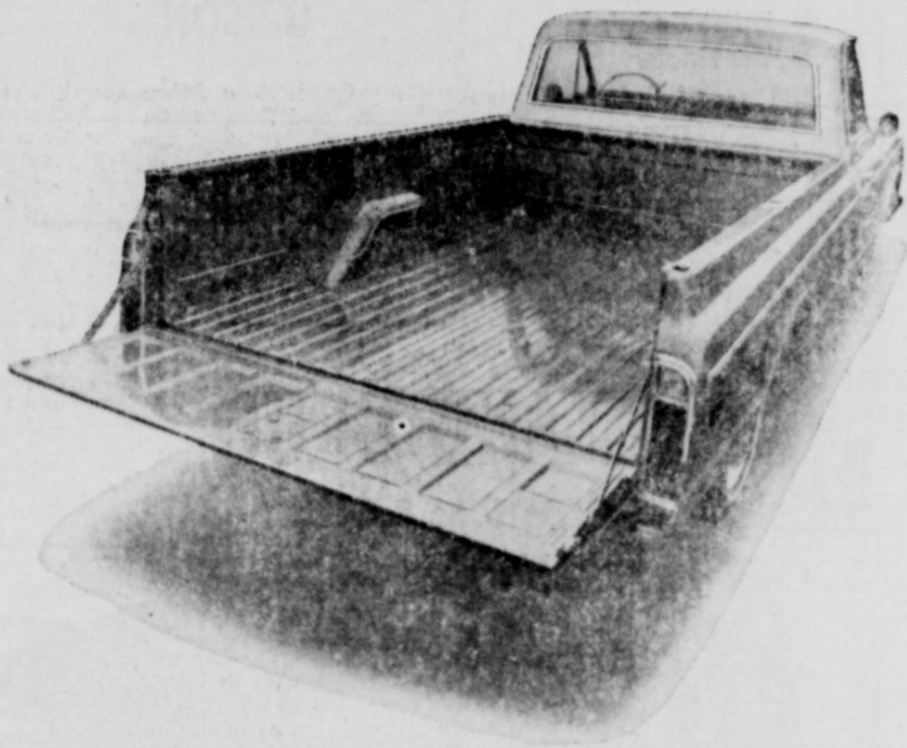

Pecan trees in Eastland County should be sprayed during the period of May 28 to May 31 reports County Agent DeMarquis Gordon. The purpose of the spray is to control the pecan nut casebearer, the most destructive insect of the pecan.

Gordon said the develop-

of the casebearer is later this year than usual. Correct timing of the spray application is most important since the insecticide must be on the tree when the young larvae are hatching and before they en-

ter the small pecans. The County Agent said two other factors are very important in the control of the insect — a thorough coverage of the tree with the insecticide solution and the use of the

correct insecticide. The recommended insecticides include Sevin, Malathion, Toxaphene and Guthion. Gordon suggests that zinc sulfate be added to the spray solution to control rosette. A fungicide

may also be added to control pecan diseases. Growers who want to get a more complete control of casebearers should spray their trees twice — about May 23 and again about June 7.

Gorman Hospital Bill Is Studied At Austin Meet

Delegations from Desdemona and Carbon of Eastland County appeared before a Texas Senate Committee in Austin Tuesday night to protest their inclusion in the proposed Gorman Hospital District. A bill creating the district has been passed by the house and now is before the senate.

Don Estes, Gorman rancher, told the Senate group that the House bill by Burke Murgrave did not include provisions that it originally contained. The house bill calls for separate elections in each of the Carbon, Desdemona and Gorman school districts on the

hospital question. Clydell Lewis of Desdemona appeared and asked that his community be left out of the district.

Ross Wilson of Gorman, head of the South Eastland County Hospital District, appeared in support of the bill. He cited a newspaper straw vote as indicating that a big majority of the people favor the matter. He said about \$60,000 has been raised in the district for the hospital, which would replace the Blackwell Hospital and Clinic at Gorman.

Gorman business men appeared to support the measure as important to community growth.

Sen. Tom Creighton and Rep. Musgrove spoke to assure the groups that their purpose was to provide legal details of the district in keeping with the wishes of the people.



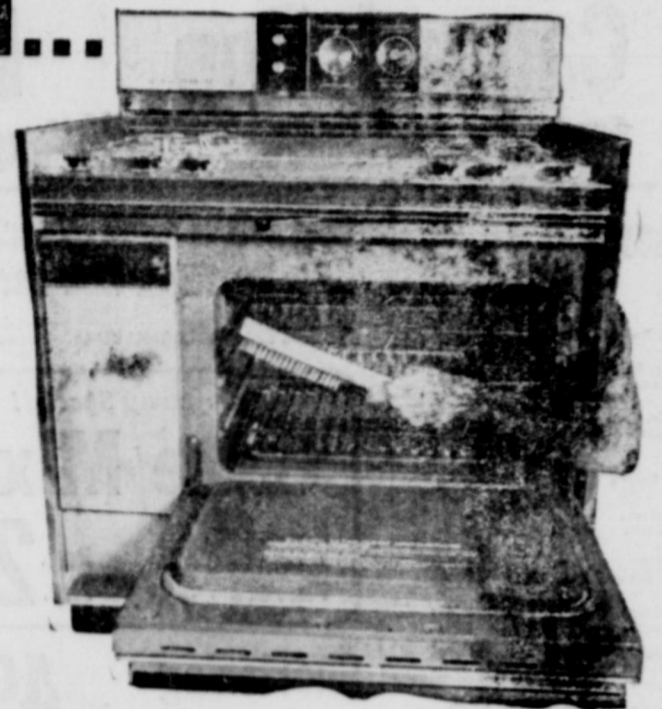
