## Eastland County To Host Law Enforcement School

Final approval has been given by the Eastland County Commissioners Court to a 20-hour law enforcement training school to be held in morning and evening sessions Aug. 4-15 in classroom space provided by Cisco Junior College, according to County Judge Scott Bailey.

The Eastland commissioners are paying \$300 for the instruction, which will be provided by Arthur Butler of the A&M University Police Training Division headed by Ira Scott.

Individual students may take the course at no expense, Judge Bailey said, and all area law enforcement officers and interested private citizens have been invited to participate. Bailey said registration is now being conducted, and he asked potential students to contact him for applications.

CJC President Leland Willis volunteered the air-conditioned college classrooms for the sessions which will be held from 10 to 12 a.m. and from 7 to 9 p.m. weekdays. The separate sessions are intended to allow both night and day-duty officers and others to attend at least part of the courses.

Bailey said the courses will include three basic areas: a primary police training course (201 in the A&M Calendar), a primary criminal investigation course, and material on traffic law enforcement and accident investigation.

The primary law enforcement course will include:

## Two New Eastland Teachers Are Named

The election of two new additional faculty members by the Eastland Independent School District Board of Trustees has been announced, completing the faculty for the 1969-70 school year with the exception of the Special Education Division of the Elementary School.

He is married and has two small children four years and three and one-half months of age. The family is expected to be in Eastland in the immediate future.

Mrs. C. M. McCoin has been named as an elementary teacher replacing Mrs. Evelyn Kirk who resigned to accept a position with the Cisco Public Schools, the place of her residence. Mrs. McCoin has been a member of the Snyder Public School faculty for a number of years until

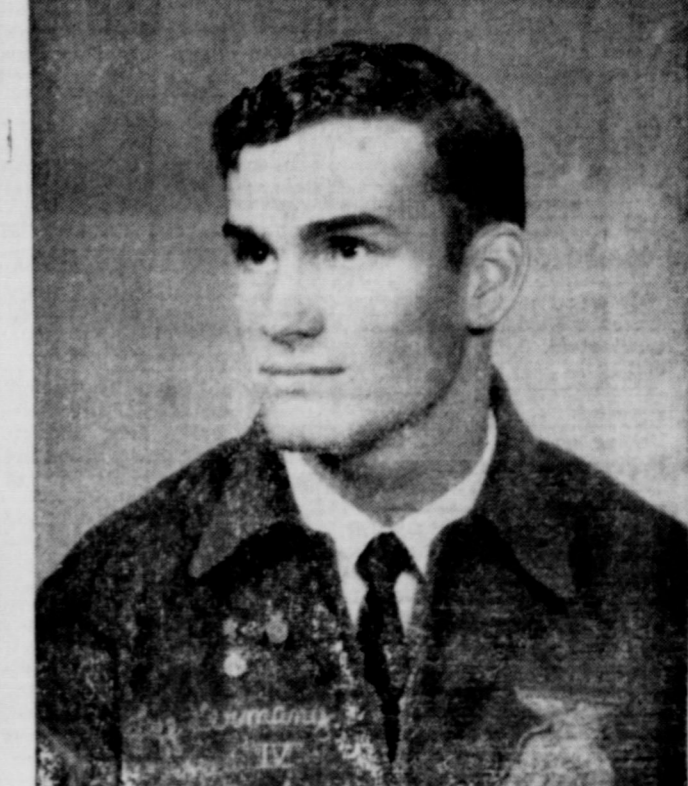

## Eddy Blair And Jeff Germany Awarded Lone Star Degrees At FFA State Meet

The highest FFA degree offered at the state level, that of Lone Star Farmer, was awarded Thursday evening in Fort Worth to Eddy Blair and Jeff Germany. They followed Don Massingill to become the second and third Eastland students ever to receive the honor.

The ceremonial program at which the degrees were bestowed on the successful candidates from throughout the state was one of the highlights of the 41st state convention of Future Farmers of America.

Approximately three thousand people attended the event which took place in the Arena of the Tarrant County Convention Center.

Among the requirements for the degree, the candidate must be in at least his third year of vocational agriculture, must have already earned the degree of Chapter Farmer, must have earned \$500 from a supervised farming program substantiated by three years of record books, and must have shown qualities of leadership and cooperation through chapter and other activities.

Mrs. Trixie Lester, Eastland High School Librarian, had surgery on her foot Wednesday and is currently recovering from the operation in a Dallas Hospital.

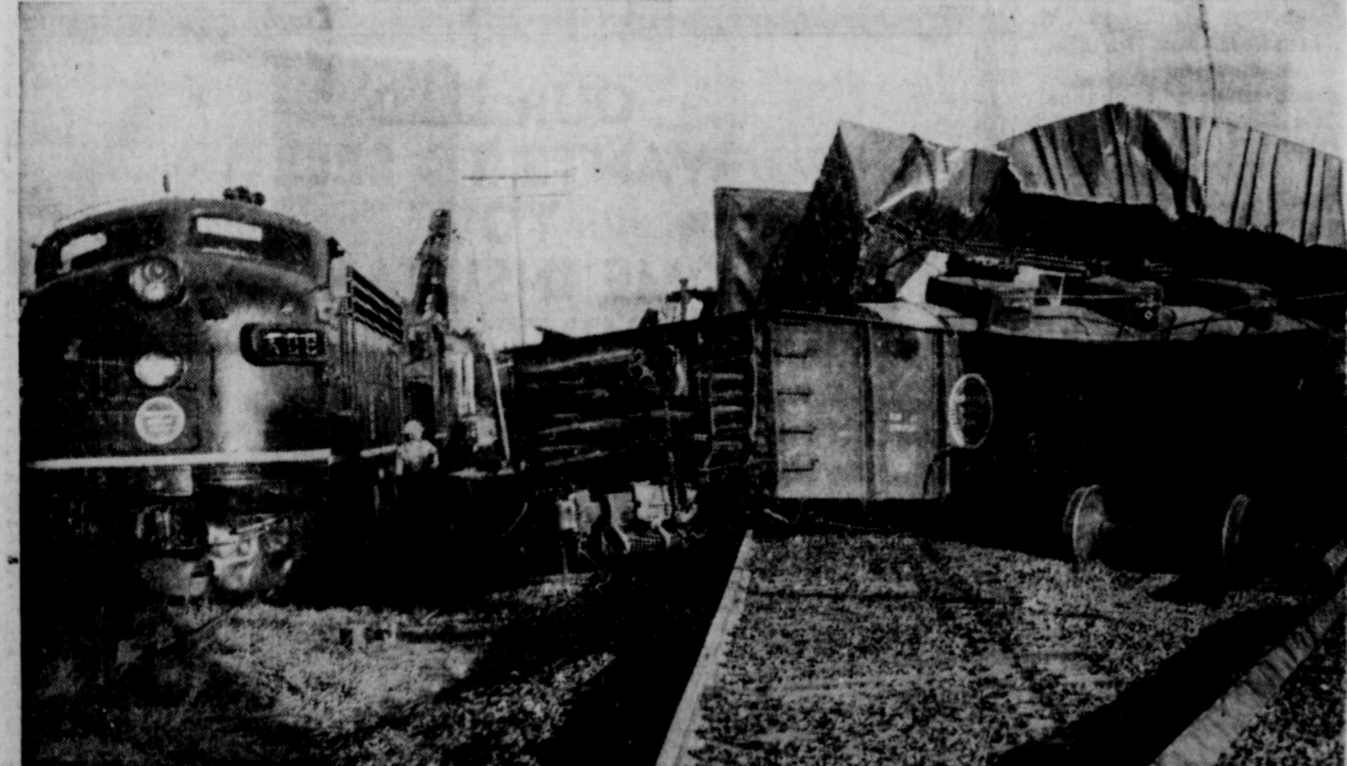

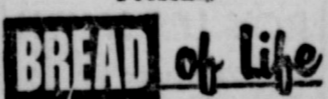
## Jaycee Auction Begins August 2

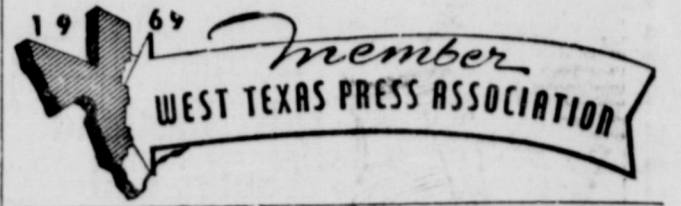

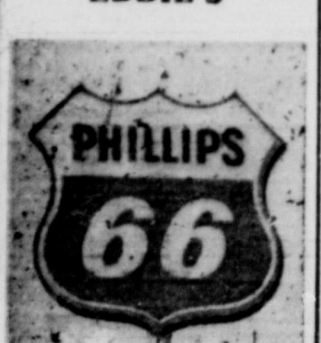
