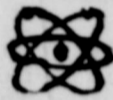

**New Director Named For Tech-Voc Division of CJC**

Cisco Junior College's Technical-Vocational Division has a new director, Robert E. Herman, who took over duties as Dean of that division of the college on July 1.

Mr. Herman comes to Cisco from Hardin-Simmons University in Abilene where he was director of the computer center.

As Dean of the Technical-Vocational Division at CJC, Mr. Herman will co-ordinate the five sections making up the college's vocational program, which are: electronic data processing, auto mechanics, vocational nursing, drafting, and office education. One of his first activities will be to assist in the publication of a promotional brochure concerning the various sections of the technical-vocational division. He taught at Chanute Junior College in Chanute, Kansas from 1957 to 1960 in the mathematics department. He came to Hardin-Simmons as a math instructor in 1960, and taught in that department until 1966 when he became director of the computer center.

He served in the U. S. Army from 1953 through 1955.

Mr. Herman is married to the former Helen Anne Hall. They have two children, Paul Alan, age 13, and Pamela Sue, age 11. They are members of the First Baptist Church, and their Cisco residence is 1012 West 12th Street.

Herman is 38 years old. Leland Willis, president of CJC, stated: "Cisco Junior College feels indeed fortunate to acquire the services of Mr. Robert E. Herman as Dean of our Technical-Vocational Division. Mr. Herman has been an outstanding college instructor and computer specialist, and we know that he will do us a fine job as co-ordinator of our various technical and vocational programs. # Story of Two Fugitives Reads Like Dime Novel Badland Saga

Two men, one with a Maltese cross tattooed on his hand and the other with a nude woman tattooed on his chest — are seemingly throwbacks to an earlier era of Texas history.

The story reads more like a dime novel badland saga than what it really is—a tale taken straight from this month's police records.

The men are daring, they are apparently resourceful, and, in police parlance, they are armed and should be considered dangerous.

—Donald Eugene Richardson, 22, of Sweetwater, Tex., sentenced to a seven-year term for theft.

**Escaped Last Month**  
A month ago last Friday they escaped from the Eastland County jail, taking advantage of sheriff and an antiquated lockup.

Since then, according to the police and FBI, they have kidnapped six persons and robbed a bank of almost \$30,000. But no law officer has seen them since they sped away in the unmarked car of Eastland County Sheriff E. L. Sublett May 27.

"If we had known where they were," say Houston FBI agent Wesley Whaley, "we could have gotten them by now."

It all began when Richardson and Jerry Baird, 18, were being escorted from the modernistic Eastland County Courthouse to the Eastland

County jail, a two-story structure built before the turn of the century.

Sublett was in charge of the prisoners that day because his husky jailer, John Shook, was on vacation.

**Sheriff Beaten**  
As the prisoners were ushered into the front door of the jail, Baird and Richardson jumped Sublett. They beat him so hard about the head and on his back that he required hospital treatment for two weeks.

Baird and Richardson took Sublett upstairs to the cells, locked the sheriff, his wife and an electrician who happened by at the wrong time, and turned loose, Webb, who was awaiting transfer to Fort Worth.

Baird was recaptured a week later, as were two other men who had escaped from the same jail before.

both types who blend into the crowd. Both are about 5-foot-10 and both are lean. Both have brown hair. But both can be easily identified from the tattoos.

**Tattoo of Heart**  
"Webb has a tattoo of a heart with an arrow piercing it in the palm of his right hand," said Whaley, "and a Maltese cross on the back of his left hand. They certainly stand out."

"Richardson has the Spanish word 'alta' tattooed on his right forearm, and the letters 'DRG' on his upper right arm. And if anyone gets close enough to him, they can see he has a tattoo of a naked woman on his chest."

The day after the two men escaped, Nancy Simmons, 17, and David Gibbs, 18, were motorboating on Lake Cisco, 10 miles west of Eastland.

When they brought their boat to shore the found two

men waiting for them. The men fit the description of Webb and Richardson.

Gibbs said the two men made him and the girl drive the boat back across the lake to a dam.

**Tried Flaggng Car**  
"We went to the top of the dam to the highway and they tried to flag down a car," said Gibbs. They were unsuccessful.

They all got back in the boat and crossed the lake.

By this time Miss Simmons' parents and her brother and sister had come to the edge of the lake to look for the teenagers. When the boat got back to shore, Gibbs said the men forced all six of them into Nancy's father's car and made him drive to Sweetwater — 100 miles to the west.

The hostages were released unharmed in Sweetwater, and the men sped off in the car.

The car was found abandoned a few hours later, but shortly after that the owner of a used car lot reported one of his cars stolen.

The FBI statistics show most bank robberies occur on Friday afternoons, when a bank is apt to have the most money on hand.

But it was on a Tuesday morning — 13 days after Gibbs and the Simmons family were kidnapped — that two men walked into the Harrisburg National Bank on the east side of Houston.

"They came in with cocked pistols," said Whaley. "They had two white pillowcases got \$28,498.84. They got away in a 1964 automobile at 10:10 a. m. in normal traffic."

The car was later found abandoned. Two weeks later, last Tuesday, Webb and Richardson were charged with robbery.

palm print in the bank," said Whaley, "and Webb was positively identified by a teller."

Whaley said the men thus far were charged with "kidnaping, auto theft, and burglary," and that they might be anywhere in the southwestern United States.

"We urge anyone who might see them not to make any move themselves," he said, "but to notify their local FBI headquarters."

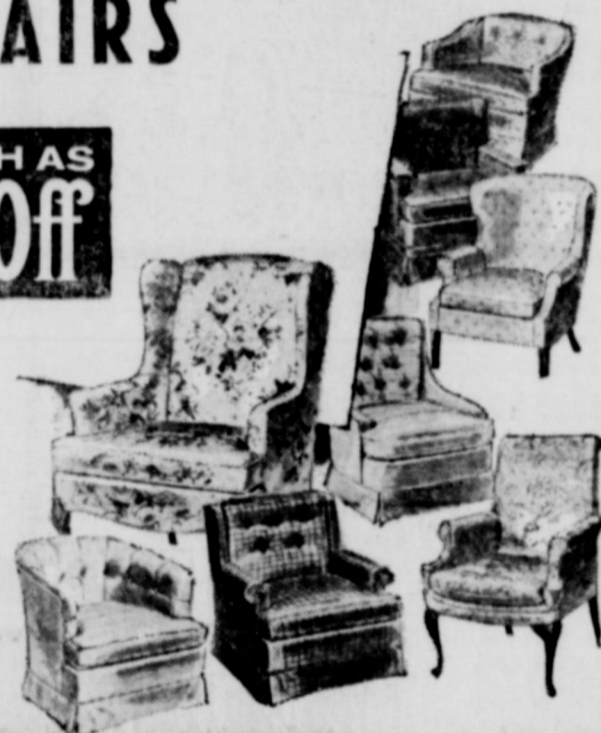

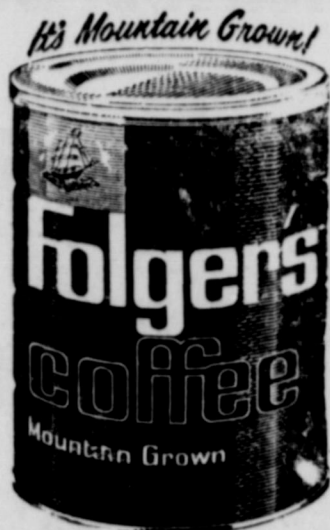

**THE GORDON SPOT**

The largest pecan tree in Eastland County is located on Kent Word's farm a few miles south of Cisco. At least that is the claim made in the summer edition of THE PECAN QUARTERLY. Mr. Word said the tree, located on the head waters of the Leon River, was a sapling when he was a young boy 80 years ago. Today the tree measures 38 inches in trunk diameter, 75 feet tall and has a limb spread of 72 feet.

The quarterly carried a picture of the tree under section titled "Can you top this one?" If you know of a larger pecan tree in Eastland County I would like to hear about it.

Several new rural homes have been built in Eastland

County during the last two years. These beautiful new homes are adding much beauty to our county.

I recently had the privilege of visiting in Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Sneed's new home near Morton Valley. The house is built on a hill which is almost the highest point in the county. From their windows they can view miles of country side in every direction.

If foliage on garden plants is turning a mottled yellow and dropping, chances are good spider mites are at work. Close inspection of the underside of the leaves may reveal a tiny red or red spotted mite. They are common during periods of hot dry weather and can be very damaging to most garden plants. Spider mites can be killed with Diagonon, Kelthane, or Malathion. However, Malathion will not control all species of spider mites. Only Diagonon and Kelthane are recommended for spider mites on ornamental plants. For more information you can get copy of L-199, "Texas Guide for Controlling Insects on Ornamental Plants," in the county agents office.

Almost all parts of Eastland County have had damaging hail and high winds during the last few weeks. Many grain fields, vegetable gardens, and fruit and nut crops have been completely destroyed. D. G. Farnbrough of Eastland is one of many who lost all their vegetables and fruit. He had berries and apricots ready to sell, but on June 19 they were all gone within thirty minutes. Many trees have been damaged by the hail and wind. The tree wounds should be protected by applying a tree dressing to the wounds.

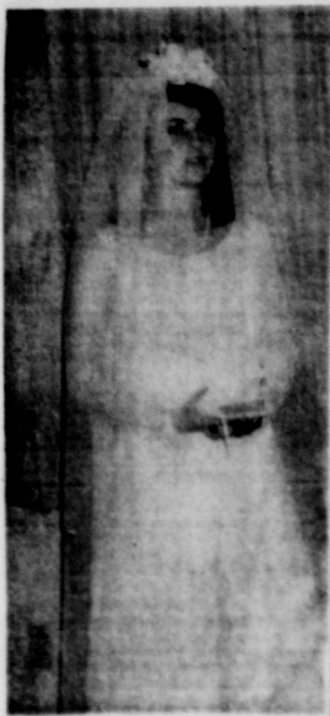
