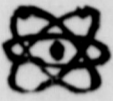

Felony jail-break charges have been filed against the five who broke out of Eastland County Jail this week, District Attorney Emory Walton reports.

No sighting of the run-aways were reported at week's end after an intensive search of the Cisco Airport Area Thursday afternoon after one was reported seen there about noon. Two others were reportedly last seen heading west out of Sweetwater late Wednesday night.

"To his knowledge, the first two, (who broke out last Sunday) have not been seen, and may or may not be armed."

"An educated guess," Walton said, is that both are in the Cisco area.

The D. A. surmised that Webb and Richardson, who kidnapped the Cisco people and forced them to take them to Sweetwater, "are not likely to return to this area."

Wayne Baird: convicted burglary; sentenced 9 years for this county.

Donald Gene Richardson: convicted felony theft; sentenced seven years in this county.

Leroy Mangum: convicted attempted rape in Stephens County; sentenced to seven years; indicted Eastland County, for robbery; awaiting trial.

Kendell Seabourn: convicted attempted rape in Stephens County; sentenced to ten years; indicted Eastland County for robbery; awaiting trial.

## Eastland Voters To Decide Thursday on Extra City Tax

Eastland residents will decide Thursday, June 5, whether they want a one per cent sales and use tax.

The election will be held on Thursday at the City Hall, with Milton Underwood presiding judge and Hoover Pittman alternate judge.

Absentee voting closed May 29 at the City Hall. If the tax is adopted, the one percent will be in addition to the three percent state tax already in effect. A certification of the election and a map of the area involved must be sent to the state comptroller before June 30 for Eastland to be eligible to collect the tax for the last quarter of this year.

A special committee appointed by Mayor Frank Deaton reported that the city must have additional income in order to pay city employees wages comparable to wages in other fields today and to cover the rising costs of materials and supplies.

The City Commissioners called the election following the study by the committee. The committee reported that city revenue was down about \$11,500.00 due mostly to the loss in water revenue caused by cessation of the Great Western Flood Operation and the small usage of water during the summer of 1968 because of the unusually large amount of rainfall.
