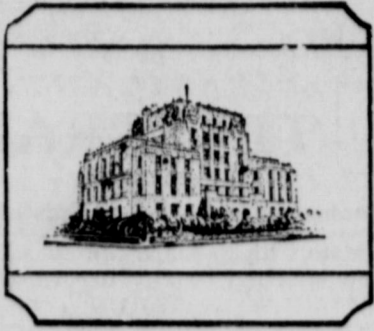

## 30-Acre Development Site Offered for Annexation

Development of a 30-acre tract on the west edge of the city for new homes, hinges on the solving of at least two major problems, Eastland City Commissioners decided at the regular monthly meeting Monday evening.

"Naturally, I'm interested in what's best for me, but I'm also interested in the development of the City. I can dispose of the property right now, and I feel sure that the land would remain pasture land, with no hope of expansion for the city to the west," he said. The property is 100 feet from the nearest waterline and about 600 feet from sewerage.

year-old, high-pressure gas line which presently runs diagonally across the land, he said. (There's also an old, leaky two-inch water line which goes to what was once the college.) Proposed streets are 60 feet wide for right-of-way and 40 feet for paving.

The city was offered the tract for annexation by Owner Mike Collins, vice president Eastland National Bank. He said that he has 14 prospective lot buyers who are ready to start building homes in the addition. The plot has a potential of 60 lots at maximum, he said. Seven of the 14 prospective buyers are presently homeowners who want to relocate into newer homes he said.

"I offer it to the city for annexation, subject to working out the details together," he told the commissioners.

At the close of the meeting the commissioners, talking informally, agreed to notify Collins that the city would be happy to consider annexation provided that he (Collins) resolves the matter of the encroachments and if the property owners provide their own curbing, guttering, water and sewerage line installation as part of the development.

### Mrs. Eva Johnson Buried Friday In El Paso Services

Mrs. Eva J. Johnson, 68, died January 21 at Eastland Memorial Hospital, where she had been a patient for 18 days.

Funeral services were scheduled for Friday in El Paso. Local arrangements were by Arrington Hamner Funeral Home.

Born October 1, 1900 in Las Cruces, New Mexico, she had lived at Lake Leon about five years. She was formerly of El Paso.

She married James R. Johnson in Las Cruces, September 10, 1931. Survivors include her husband; one son, Joseph R. Johnson of Hollywood, California; one step-son, James L. Johnson of Riverside, California; one daughter, Mrs. Dorothy Hooks of El Paso; two sisters, Mrs. Dorothy Hanny of Las Cruces and Mrs. Billie Wise of Quitaque, and four grandchildren.

"The question," Collins said, "is getting to the property. The Blair St. entrance is blocked," he said, "because a home owner on that street owns an acre in what might be considered the natural extension of the street."

The Eastland City Commission took giant steps toward developing this area during a regular monthly session at City Hall Monday evening.

Collins bought the property in August 1968, he said, and a deed regarding the Plummer St. entrance was filed in October, he said. Collins holds an option on the American Legion property on West Main St., which conceivably could be bought and utilized as an entrance to the property. The choicer building sites are located on the center of the plot, he said.

Paramount was a preliminary agreement with officials of the Carbon Water Supply District to provide water to that system which is being developed through the Farmers Home Administration. At the same time, the City Commission "looked toward the future" in thinking about providing water for what is hoped to be developed at the intersection of Carbon and Eastland.

The Eastland group, through their engineer, K. G. Johnson, asked for a four-inch water connection south of Eastland, and the City Fathers decided that it would be in the best interest to extend a six-inch line from the Valley View area (on the extreme South City Limits) south past the Interstate 20 highway, where Carbon can tie on with their four inch line and probably install a pump station to lift the water to Carbon - a 195 foot uphill lift. To Carbon, according to their engineer. Cost of the water and exact location of the meter point will be worked out, between attorneys for the two units. (Costs will probably be in the cost plus ten per cent. category -- the same as is charged the Olden Water Supply District.)

## Trio In Custody On Variety Charges

Three Cisco youths were in the Eastland County jail today after their arrest over the weekend on charges in connection with the abduction of a Cisco Junior College coed last Thursday night at Lake Cisco Park.

In custody were LeRoy Mangum, 18, and Kendall Seabourn, 19, both natives of Cisco, and Woodrow Raper, 18, who moved to Cisco several months ago from California.

District Attorney Emory Walton filed charges against the three youths last Saturday night in justice of the Peace W. L. Lewis' court in Cisco, charging them with armed robbery and abduction of a female. Bond was set at \$5,000 for each of the trio.

On Monday, officials filed charges of rape against the three in Stephens County at Ereckenkridge. The charges were filed by Don Ragland, Stephens County sheriff, in Justice J. W. Dadds' court. Bond was set at \$25,000 for each of the youths.

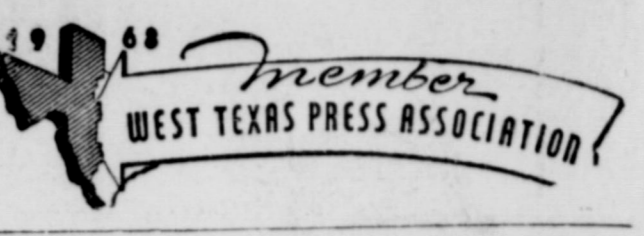

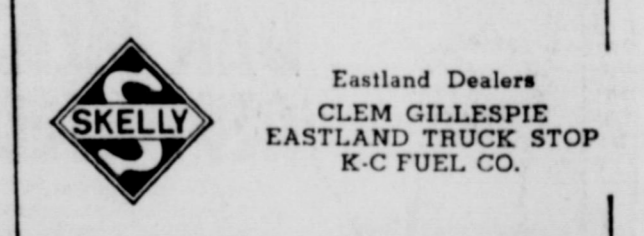

families and close friends attended the ceremony and reception which followed in the home of the bride's parents.

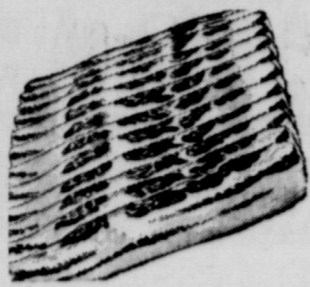
A white cashmere coat with matching mink collar completed the bride's ensemble for a wedding trip.

Delivering maps and giving a progress report, Magness explained that the city's right-of-way responsibility in the project will involve only a small 15 by 22 foot strip on College St.

The proposed project, which is to be a first-class FM road, 24 feet wide, with extra-heavy base, will leave U. S. 80 at College St. on the west side of town, and proceed alongside the Hollywood Vassarett plant, go between houses, (west of its present winding location, cross the M&P Railroad Tracks at the same crossing, then swing left to clear the Texas Lightweight Aggregate plant (haydite plant) and a new bridge will be built south of the existing bridge over the Lake Eastland leg, and proceed to the T intersection, taking the Yellow Mound Road, pass the Varge Daniel place, and tie into Highway 183.

This particular highway is believed very important because of the heavy traffic in the area, and is expected to be a boon to the Livestock Raisers Livestock Show at the County Sheriff's Posses facilities. The road will go near the Lakeside Country Club golf course but will not disturb the present layout, Magness said.

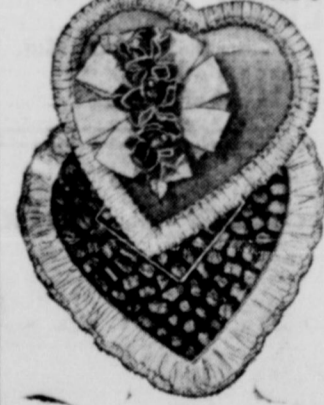

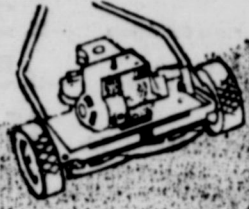

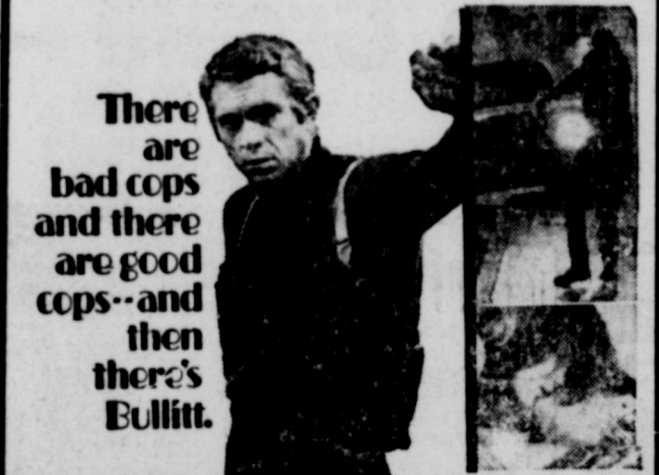

# Damage Suit Against Safeway Is Dropped

The jury declared in the 1968 case that the accident was caused by the truck, not Parten, said Burke.
