Webb Guilty, Gets 75 Years

A 91st District Court jury took 30 minutes Tuesday to find Harvey Dale Webb, 21, of Belcambre, La., guilty of rape as charged.

Judge Earl Conner Jr. set the sentence at 75 years in the penitentiary. The trial opened Monday morning.

District Attorney Emory Walton said that Webb, who called himself "Clyde Bar-

row," traveled with two companions, "Jesse James" Smith of Freeport, La., and "Bonnie Parker" Collins of Pioneer, La. The trio kidnaped a 20-year-old man and a 17-year-old girl in Fort Worth April 11, 1968. Webb raped the girl in Eastland County.

The kidnaped couple was driven to Borden County and put out beside a farm-to-market road. The Louisiana trio went to Arizona where they were arrested for armed robbery there April 16. Each of the three received five to seven years sentence when they were tried for the Arizona robbery.

Webb was sentenced to 25 years in a Fort Worth trial on charges of armed robbery concerning the car used to drive the kidnaped couple across this area of Texas. Kidnapping charges against Webb are still pending in Fort Worth. Smith and the Collins girl have not been tried in Ft. Worth yet.

M. H. Perry of Eastland was foreman of the jury. Other jurors were Eugene Rhodes and S. C. Cotton, both of Rising Star; Jack C. Bearden of Ranger; Don L. Choate and Mrs. L. E. Booth, both of Cisco; Jeff M. Glazner, W. L. Nicholson, James W. Eidson, Ben W. McKinnis, Walter B. Maynard and E. C. Ragland, all of Eastland.

Attorneys Saul Pullman and Tommy Warford were court-appointed for Webb.

GREAT CONCERN is prevalent here over the widespread of "pandering advertisements" being received through the mail by persons who do not want to receive the, oft-times near obscene material. Individual postal patrons need to work with the post office in stopping this kind of objectionable mailings. Once on, names on some mailing lists are hard to get off, but now it can be done.

Aztec Approved For Labor Training Funds

Eastland's Aztec Mobile Homes, Inc., is one of three firms in Texas which will train jobless or unemployed persons under new contracts approved this week by Secretary of Labor George P. Shultz.

In an announcement by Cong. Omar Burleson, on-the-job training is provided by private firms, industrial associations, labor organizations and others with Labor Department reimbursement for job instructor fees and instructional materials only. The trainees receive wages paid by the employer during the period of training.

Aztec is approved for 50 mobile home installers, for a period of 17 weeks, in the amount of \$25,500 MDTA funds, the announcement said.

Other firms approved include East Texas Fabricated Steel, Inc., six welder-fitters, 30 weeks, \$5,400 in Jefferson; and C. W. H. Manufacturing Corp., Wichita Falls, 100 mobile home installers, 17 weeks, \$51,760.

Olden Vote Challenged -- Board Issues Its Statement

The recent school election at Olden is being contested and four points, and the Olden School Board has issued a statement regarding the charges.

The notice of contest came at the County Commissioners Court meeting Monday as the Olden school vote came up for canvass. Dr. Dick Hodges, speaking for some 25 people at the meeting, asked for a delay on the canvass pending the investigation of alleged irregularities in the April 5 vote.

He listed these as follows: 1. The absentee vote clerk was not eligible for the position. 2. No notice of the election was published prior to election day. 3. No voting booths were provided. 4. The ballot was not in the form as had been certified by the county judge.

Judge Scott Bailey said the court complied with Hodges' request and set Monday, April 21, as a special meeting to reconsider and canvass the vote.

Statement issued by the Olden School Board is as follows:

"With reference to an article which was published in the Abilene Reporter morning edition of April 15 the following reply is being submitted.

1. The Board of Trustees, of Olden Independent School District, did not knowingly violate any election laws in the recently contested election.

2. In our opinion, election of any or all of the four have changed the final outcome of a 2 to 1 voting margin.

3. We will willingly call another election for the purpose of filling two places on the school board if the District Attorney, County Judge, and Commissioners Court, deem it necessary.

R. L. Perkins, Civic Leader, Is Buried Tuesday

Roland L. Perkins, Sr., 79, died at 8:20 a.m. Monday, April 14, in Eastland Memorial Hospital. He had been a patient for three weeks.

Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Tuesday in Arrington Hamner Funeral Chapel, with the Rev. Robert Marsh, pastor of First Presbyterian Church, and the Rev. Haston Brewer, pastor of First Baptist Church, officiating.

Burial was in the Eastland Cemetery.

Mr. Perkins was born Sept. 3, 1889 in Jackson, Miss., and married Miss Jessie C. McClurkin in 1911 in Springtown. He had lived at 407 S. Dixie for 51 years. He was the retired manager of Higginbotham Bartlett Lumber Co. and was retired from the United States Navy.

He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church and Masonic Lodge No. 467; and a charter member of the Rotary Club. He was a member of the City Commission which established the first water filtration plant and purchased the first firetruck.

Survivors include his wife; one son, Col. R. L. Perkins Jr. of Taipei, Taiwan; one daughter, Mrs. James O. Kirk of Pasadena; two sisters, Mrs. Neilas Malone and Mrs. Claude Lyle, both of Springtown; & four grandchildren.

Pallbearers were Wyndie Armstrong, Bill B. Hart, Bob Perkins, Jack Elliott, Darwin Miller and James Wright. Honorary pallbearers were members of the Masonic Lodge and the Rotary Club.
