Reports Due On Earnings to SS

ies, born in 1908 or later, who earned over \$1680 in 1970 are required to file a report of their earnings with the social Security Administration by April 15, 1971. This report is in addition to any Federal or State tax return and it must be filed with the Social Security Administration according to R. R. Tuley social security manager for Abilene.

People receiving disability benefits are not required to file the annual report of earnings, but should report immediately if they become self-employed or take a job. All other beneficiaries, in-cluding families of disabled persons, are under the retirement test and each must report his earnings annually, if more than \$1680.

He added that the purpose of social security benefits is to replace some of the earnings lost due to retirement, death, or disability. If an individual continues to earn a amountsubstantial than \$1680 - some adjustment must be made in the amount of his benefits. 
