



Coryell county agent, said in a dis. just closed. cussion of "Feeding Ton Litters" before the dairy and swine section of the nineteenth annual farmers short course here.

"We find that properly fed sows produce more pigs to the litter and that the quality of these pigs cite the experience of A. D. Champers, who fed the heaviest litter use only.




