If Democrats are willing to fight the campaign on the basis of these seven simple points, the ground is laid for the 1940 battle.

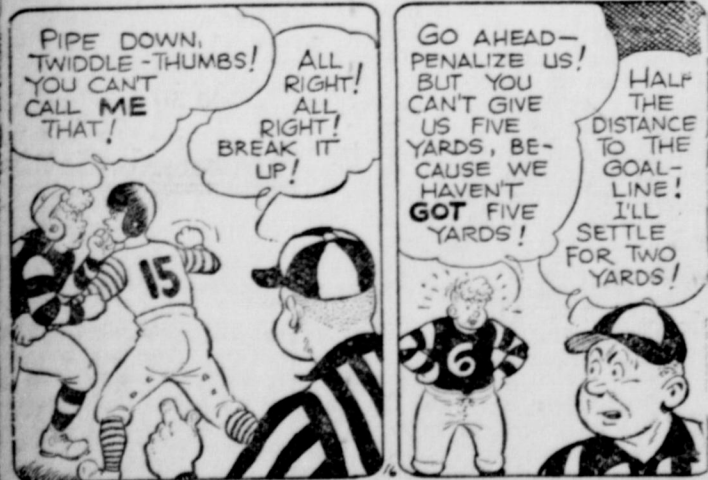
Here are issues everyone can understand. They are stated simply, and they concern vital affairs at home.

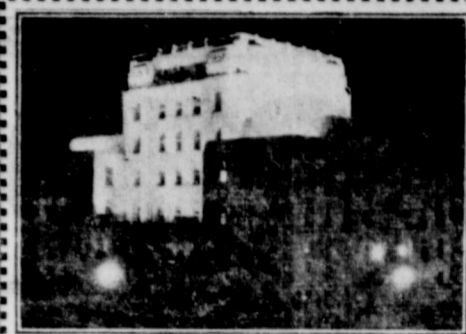

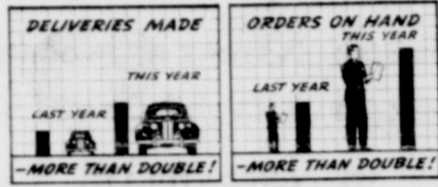
All classes of livestock gained substantially as the equivalent of 10,509 rail cars moved to both interstate and intrastate points

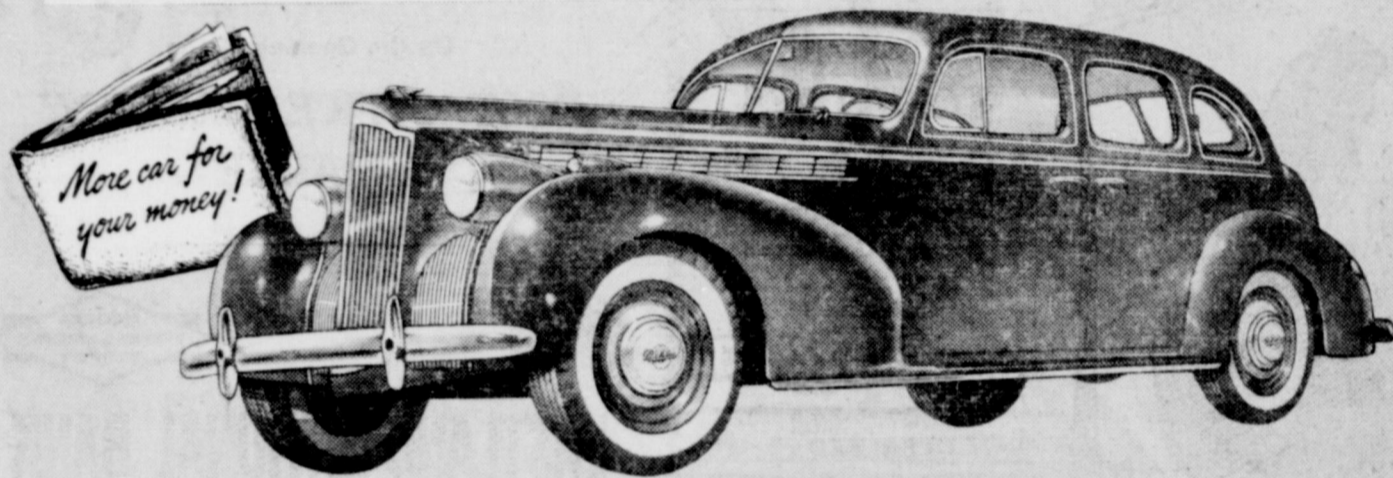
