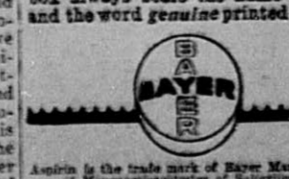

"My opinion is that the entire tariff act should be rewritten with a view to increasing some schedules, especially those relating to agriculture, and reducing many, many others. Of course this cannot be done with a minority of 164 against a majority of 268 in the House, so we must accept the best possible."

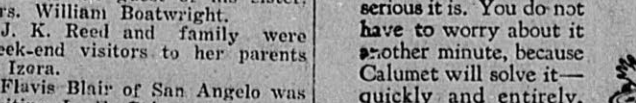
