COAL MINERS AGREE TO TAKE LOWER WAGES

This Will Permit Deep Mines and Providing Work For Men Otherwise Idle.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Aug. 25.

—Representatives of the United
Mine Workers of America and
officials of the Southwestern
Coal Operators association today had reached an agreement over into effect the 1917 wage scale of \$5.00 a day in lieu of the present \$7.50.

The agreement after representatives of both sides had been in conference for three days. The new contract will become effective September 1 and expire March 31, 1931. The and expire March 31, 1931. The wage reduction, which applies only to members of the Southwestern association, affects between 8,000 and 10,000 miners in Missouri, Oklahoma, Kansas, Arkansas and Texas fields.
