### RANGER COLLEGE SELECTED FOR AREA PIANO AUDITIONS

A number of piano teachers and their most outstanding pupils will come to Ranger Sunday to take part in the National Piano Teachers Guild auditions, which will be sponsored by Ranger Junior College.

The auditions will be held in the Fine Arts Building of the college, and will be supervised by Fred D. Baumgardner, head of the Music Department of the college.

Ranger is only one of 450 centers where the auditions will be held during May. Participants will come from Eastland, Cisco, Throckmorton, Breckenridge, Putnam, Baird, Strawn and Ranger.

These auditions have been called something like a "trackmeet" for pianists. Pupils range from beginners to advanced students. They will receive ratings on a national scale. Expert advice will be given to both pupils and their teachers.

Diplomas given to those who qualify are classified as "High School", "Collegiate", and "Young Artists". Those in all grades who do satisfactory work in the spring auditions may take part in the autumn International Recording Festival, and win prizes ranging from five dollars to seven hundred fifty dollars. Also, many music scholarships result from these auditions.

Judges for the Ranger auditions will be Miss Jane Stanley, of Long Beach, California, a nationally known piano teacher and the author of a popular textbook "Basic Routines in Elementary Piano Teaching"; and Dr. Henry Myer, Dean of Southwestern University at Georgetown, also a nationally known musician.

The National Piano Teachers Guild was founded 25 years ago by Dr. Irl Allison, of Austin. It now embraces the entire United States. Charles Kiker, Ranger Junior College music teacher, assisted Dr. Allison in founding the guild.

This is the first year that the spring auditions will be held in Ranger. At a Guild meeting in Austin last January Ranger Junior College was selected to sponsor the auditions for this area.
