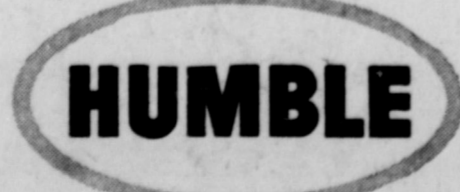

Committee Chairmen of Eastland And Some Other Sections Are Announced In Cancer Crusade

The Rev. Jackson C. Oglesby, pastor of First Methodist Church is the 1955 Cancer-Crusade chairman for Eastland, announced Miss Katherine Daniels of Dallas, field representative, Texas Division, American Cancer Society.

Miss Daniels spent Monday and Tuesday in the Joseph M. Perkins home here, conferring with Mrs. Perkins who is vice president of the Texas Division of the American Cancer Society and a member of the national board of directors. Daniels was assisted also by Bill Walters who is secretary of the society's branch office here at Eastland, located in Mrs. Perkins' "Little Red School House," 1021 S. Seaman.

The Cancer Crusade will be conducted during April throughout the nation. Miss Daniels is in charge of the crusade in District 14, which includes about 40 counties in northeast and north west Texas.

The American Cancer Society is the only voluntary health agency in the United States devoted to the control of cancer through a comprehensive program of education, service and research. It is supported wholly by voluntary contributions from the public, which in the past year totalled more than 16 million dollars.

Statistics On Cancer Deaths
Forty-four persons died of cancer in Eastland County last year, Miss Daniels said. Cancer is the second greatest cause of death in this country today. About 200,000 persons in the United States will

probably die of cancer this year. This means 548 every day, 23 every hour, 1 every three minutes. These figures are doubly tragic because many of these people who will die could live. Early detection and proper treatment could save them. That is the reason for the first of the three-fold cancer program—education, the other two being service and research.

Miss Daniels announced committee chairmen for Eastland and a section of the county and will announce those for Ranger and Cisco soon, she said.

Committee Chairmen Named
Besides the Rev. Mr. Oglesby, Cancer Crusade chairman for Eastland, the following committee chairmen have been chosen: Mrs. Travis Wheat, chairman of neighbor to neighbor crusade in Eastland; Dr. Jim Whittington, chairman of professional division; Mrs. John Love, Rt. 1, Ranger, chairman of the county communities committee for Eastland County who will be in charge of raising funds in the smaller communities of the county; Mrs. A. Louise Weber of Rising Star, chairman of the Rising Star Crusade.

To Attend District 13 Meeting
The Rev. Mr. Oglesby, Mrs. Love and Mrs. Perkins plan to attend the District 13 Crusade meeting in Mineral Wells March 11. Miss Daniels will help with the program which will be conducted by Curt Reimann of Austin, executive director, Texas Division, American Cancer Society. He will be assisted also by Miss Gertrude Linn, director of the Department of Field Activities.

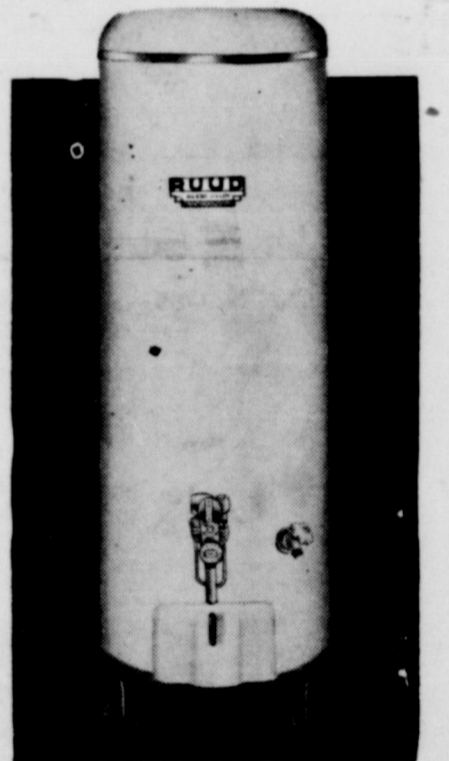

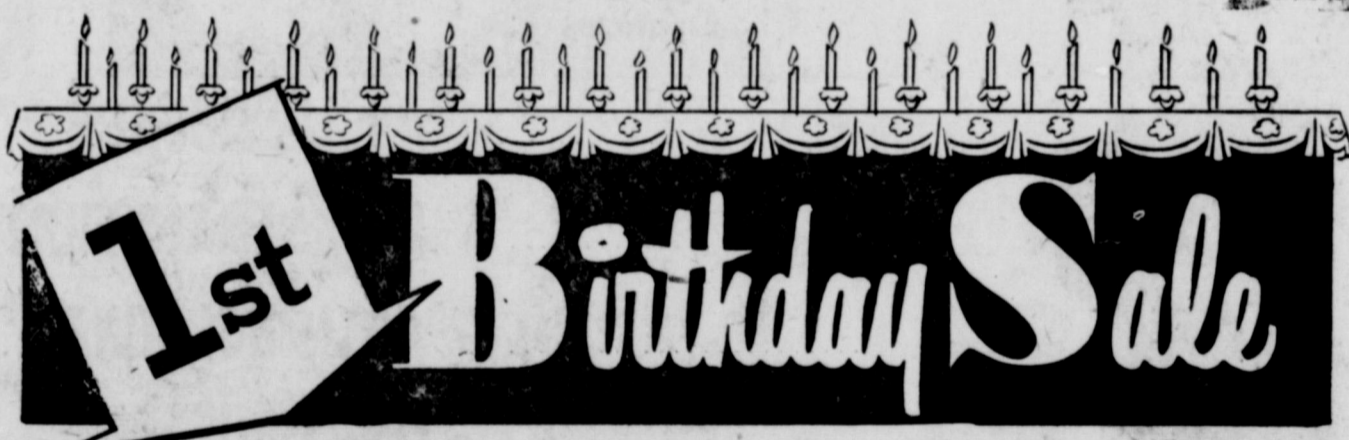

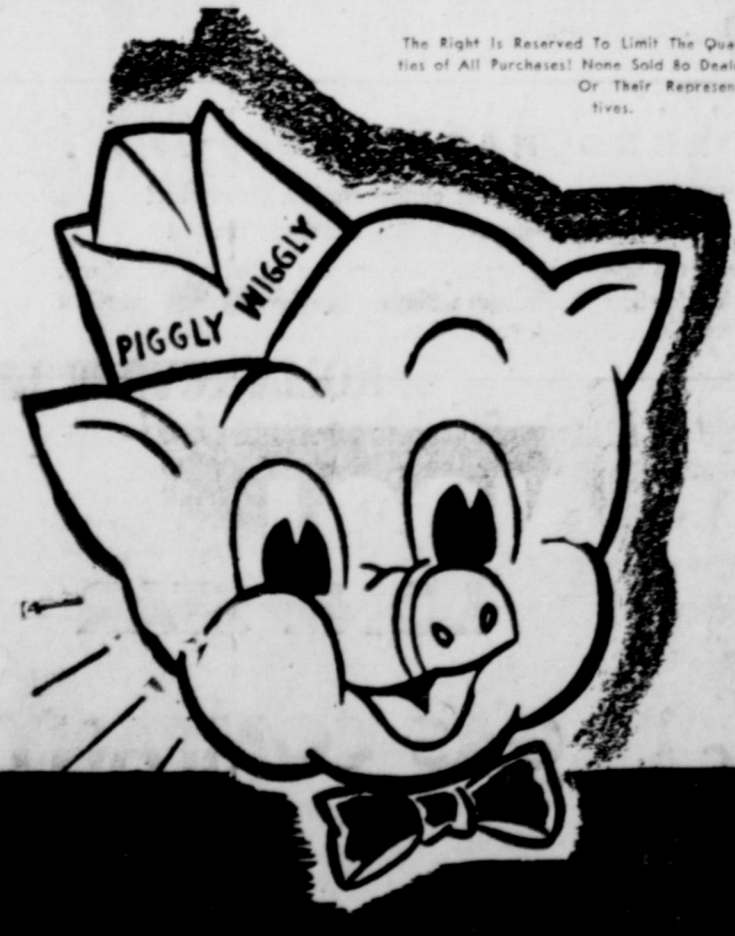
