Allan Jolly will represent Eastland at the 1972 session of Texas American Legion Boys State, Commander W.Q. Verner of Dulin - Daniel Post No. 70 of the American Legion here announced today. Allan is the son of Dr. and Mrs. J.O. Jolly of Eastland.

The 1972 Texas American Legion Boys State will be in session from June 7 to June 13, 1972, at the University of Texas, Austin, Commander Verner said.

Departments of the American Legion will sponsor 51 of these Boys States this summer. Two outstanding youths from each of the American Legion Boys States will go to American Legion Boys Nation in July in Washington, D.C., where they will study federal government organization and operation in much the same manner as the Boys State delegates participate in training in state government.

During their Boys State sessions, the Eastland youth will participate in the organization of political parties, campaigns, elections, and the enactment and enforcement of their own laws within a mythical state.

"As one of the Legion's outstanding youth training programs, Boys State affords these youngsters an opportunity to learn the functions of government," Commander Verner said. "Also, they will see the importance of the role a good citizen has in discharging his citizenship responsibilities. They soon discover how good government depends upon the active interest of every citizen."

The fruit may be used into a cobbler. Here is how - 2 or 3 cups of the green grapes, add water just to top of grapes. Mix two and one half cups sugar with three tablespoons flour and add to grapes. Cook until slightly tender but not mushy. Pour into a large flat oblong pan or two pie pans. Dot with butter or margarine. Lattice top with short cake dough. Bake in 425 degree oven for 25 to 30 minutes.

LOOKS AS though Lone Star Gas Co. has declined Eastland's offer of a six percent rate increase. The company asked 10 percent and wrote the commission as follows:

(1) Careful consideration has been given to the City Council's 6 percent rate increase offer which evolved in the May 15th meeting. We, the management of Lone Star, feel that in view of

the factual 12.63 percent revenue deficiency existing in Eastland it is inadvisable from an economic standpoint to compromise further on the needed increase in revenue, and most respectfully decline the offer.

"As pointed out in our Revenue Deficiency Statement (Exhibit 6) of our rate application, a 12.63 percent increase in revenue is necessary for our company to earn a fair 13 percent rate of return on the Eastland investment, but that we would compromise the need by asking for only a 10 percent increase in revenue, which would adjust our earnings, investment-wise, from the present 4.7 percent to 6.9 percent.

"Acceptance of the City's 6 percent revenue increase proposal would provide only a 1.2 percent increase in rate of
