## Valley View Lodge Opening Oct. 22

Eastland's newest nursing home, the 102 bed Valley View Lodge will hold Open House Sunday, Oct. 22, between the hours of 2 and 5 p.m., Administrator Mrs. Eugene Frost has announced.

The beautiful new home is located on the 700 block of Ostrom Street in Eastland.

The structure was built and furnished by BJB&R Construction Co. of Collinsville, and is to be operated by Valley View Lodge Inc. a corporation made up by R.W. McDonnell of Collinsville, Billie Joe Browning and Gene Frost. Valley View Lodge is

classified as a skilled nursing home and as such is qualified to accept intermediate three and skilled nursing patients. Valley View Lodge is qualified to care for patients under Old Age Assistance, or those eligible for

Medicaid, in addition to private paying patients. Medicaid is the extended care portion of the Medicare program.

Valley View Lodge is

designed and is licensed and staffed to care for patients needing intensive care.

Medicaid Intermediate IV patients (skilled nursing care),

and Medicaid Intermediate III patients (moderate nursing care). Qualified staffing is planned on a 24-hour basis at Valley View Lodge. Residents receive home-like atmosphere with beautiful furnishings and recreational facilities. The building is completely fire retardant and fire protected by automatic fire warning devices.

The cost at Valley View

Lodge, said Mrs. Frost, under the State Medicaid program is the same for all nursing homes.

Among the many features of Valley View Lodge are:

Private rooms have private baths, dining room, recreational room, chapel, beauty-barber shop, isolation room, examination room, organ, cable TV in color, therapy, game tables, fire control doors, piano, and

recreational program.

Mrs. Frost expressed appreciation to all who have applied for employment, and as need for more personnel increases, she will be contacting other applicants, she said. The nursing home will continue to accept applications for employment, she said.

## Mavericks Cream Bucks

The Eastland Mavericks went on their fourth rampage of the season Friday night but this rampage could not really be called a rampage. It would be, in my opinion, a close fought ball game, with Eastland winning over the Breckenridge Buckaroos nothing less than fabulous game, 20-12.

The climate at Buckaroo field at the beginning of the game was perfect for a football game, with Eastland winning the toss and electing to receive on the North end of the field.

The Bucks kicked to the Mavs from their 45. Number 32 Larry Barnes for Eastland received the ball for Eastland and brought it back to the Eastland 35. From there, after a series of plays which included one fumble by Eastland, brought the ball to rest on the Bucks 34 yard line before Larry Boles kicked for Eastland at about the 45 yard line.

Boles kicked to the Bucks 14 yard line. From their 14 it was 1st and 10 for the Bucks. On first down, Garvin hands off to running back 23 and is hit behind the line by Tony Thomas for Eastland. On 2nd down no. 12 hands off to Herring who then made a spectacular run through to Eastland defensive line for a 90 yard touchdown run. Extra point try was no good.

The score now stood at Bucks 6 - Eastland 0.

The Bucks kicked to Eastland from their 35 yard line after five yard penalty for an out of bounds kick. Eastland's Howard King received the ball on the Eastland 15 and ran it back to the Mavs 45. After three plays were run Eastland had brought the ball to the 46 yard line of the Bucks 4th and one to go. John Jimenez, quarterback, handed off to King and he ran 45 yards. Morren kicked for extra point and the score stood 7-6 Eastland's favor.

Eastland kicked to Breckenridge at the Eastland 35 after an out of bounds kick was repeated. The Bucks received the ball at the 25 for no gain on the run. On the third down play for Breck Garvin passed but Leo Gaeta for Eastland intercepted and ran

30 yards for Eastland's second touchdown of the night. Morren kicked and the score stood 14-6 Eastland.

Morren kicked on Eastland to the Bucks 16 where it was run back to the 36 of Breck. From there they moved the ball down to the Eastland 28 by a long run by Herring for the Bucks. After the three plays by the Bucks they were left with eight yards to go for the first down and kicked to Eastland.

Eastland received at the 25 yard line. After four plays Eastland was unable to move the ball to a first down. Boles kicked to the Breck 35, where it remained at the end of the first quarter.

On the next series of plays Breck moved the ball down to the Eastland 43 where 12 kicked for the bucks, down to the Eastland three yard line. Eastland first and 10 at the three. After two plays Jimenez fumbled the ball in the snap and Breckenridge received on the Eastland 10 yard line.

Breckenridge, after two plays went in for the score, and that brought the score to 14 to 12 still in favor of Eastland.

Breckenridge kicked to the Eastland 45. After three plays Eastland was forced to kick. Boles kicked to the 26 yard line of Breckenridge and there it was 1st and 10. After three plays Breckenridge fumbled at the 36 yard line and Eastland received.

Eastland took over the ball at Breckenridge 34. On second down King ran for 25 yards down to the Breck 1 yard line. After two plays King went in for the touchdown and the last score for the ball game. Eastland 20, Breckenridge 12 at the end of the first half.

There was no scoring in the second half.

The weather couldn't have been better for peanut harvest the last three weeks. But even the peanut growers are wanting rain now. The late peanuts that have not been dug need rain. Ranchers in the northern part of Eastland County have been

needing rain all year. This has been the driest year since 1956 according to the records of the Eastland Weather Bureau official. James Dabney's records show 12.22 inches of rain in Eastland since January 1st. That is about 14 in. below normal for this time of year. Residents in parts of the county say they have had even less rain than Eastland. Fortunately, the drought has not affected most agricultural production in the County. While some individuals will have lower yields because of dry

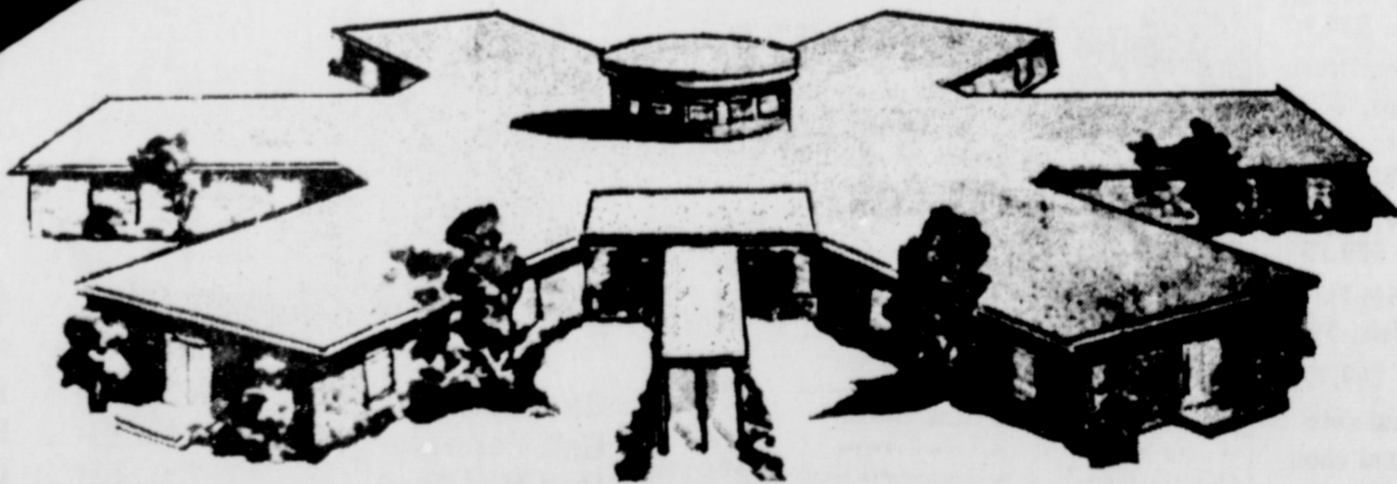

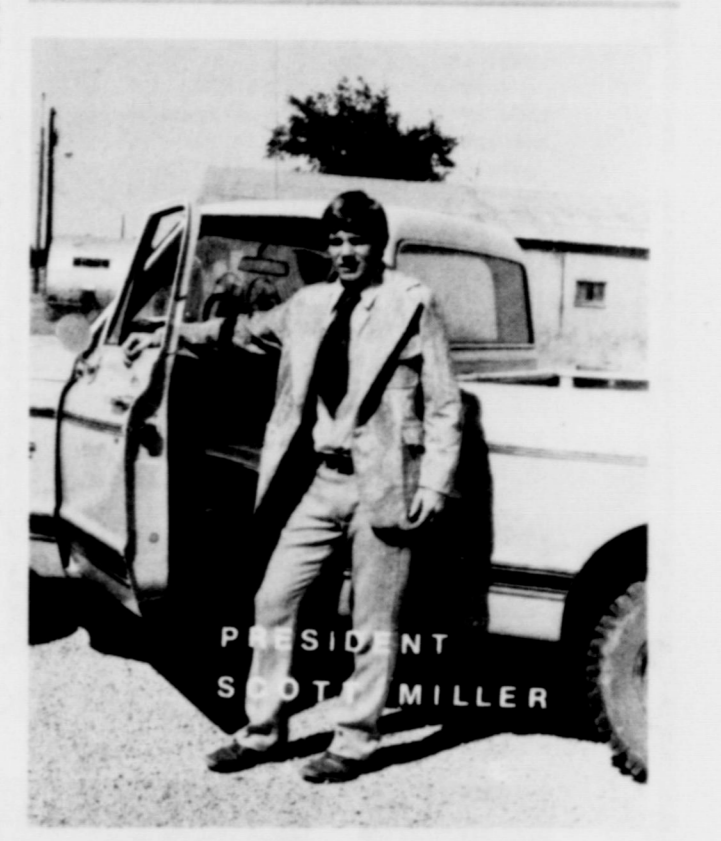
