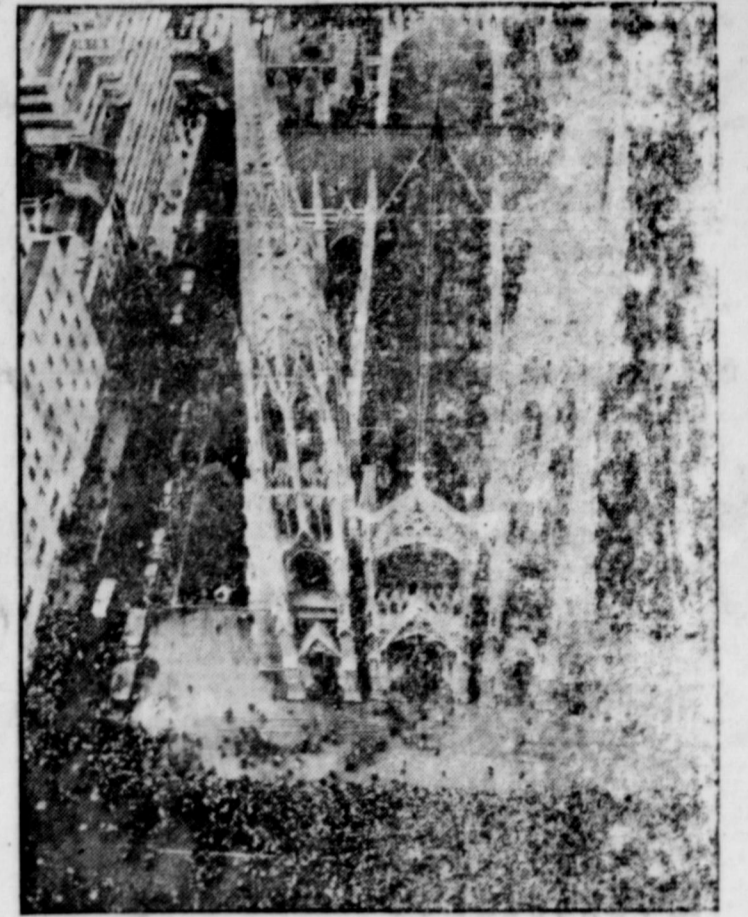

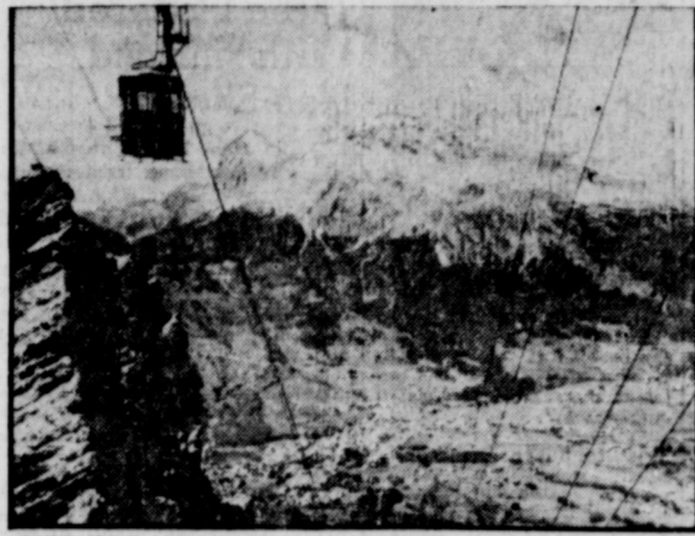

Auto Driving Is Privilege; Not A Right

Did you ever stop to think that you haven't any "right" to drive an automobile—that driving is a privilege, and like all privileges it carries with it definite responsibilities?

This point was brought out today by R. B. Rooper, Chief Safety Engineer, Humble Oil & Refining Company, and President, Texas Safety Association, who is vitally interested in the know and obey traffic laws program now being conducted by the Texas Safety Association, the Texas Department of Public Safety, and the National Safety Council.

"There's nothing on the statute books or on a driver's license that refers to the right to drive," Mr. Rooper said. "The privilege of driving a car is given to the citizen and he is expected to accept the responsibility it entails."

Mr. Rooper said that in its broadest sense such responsibility means the driver's responsibility for his own safety and the safety of everyone else who uses the public thoroughfares.

"This, of course, includes obeying all traffic laws and ordinances," he said, "because traffic laws, which are based on a combination of experience and common sense, are made for the protection of the public."

Mr. Rooper reminded persons who are in the habit of taking traffic laws lightly that such an attitude is bound to get them in trouble. He said that traffic law violators constantly expose themselves to the possibility of losing their licenses, being fined or jailed, or becoming involved in fatal accidents.

"Even without the threat of these serious consequences," Mr. Rooper said, "the trustworthy citizen should be willing to accept his responsibility to drive safely at all times."

Mr. Rooper reminded every driver to do his share to make the know and obey traffic laws program a success. He believes that if each individual accepts his responsibility for his own safety and for the safety of all he meets in traffic, the Texas traffic accident toll can be cut substantially.

FIXIN-UP TIPS

For the Home

Better Miter Box

HERE'S a miter box that has two advantages. Miterers can be cut on either or both sides, and the outfit has a solid base. Take three



pieces of 1 x 2 lumber and cut them to a length of 10 inches, according to American Builder. Nail them to a 2 x 4 about 24" long into which 45-degree miterers and a straight cut have been sawed. Finally, nail a piece of 1 x 2 about two feet long on each side of the 2 x 4.

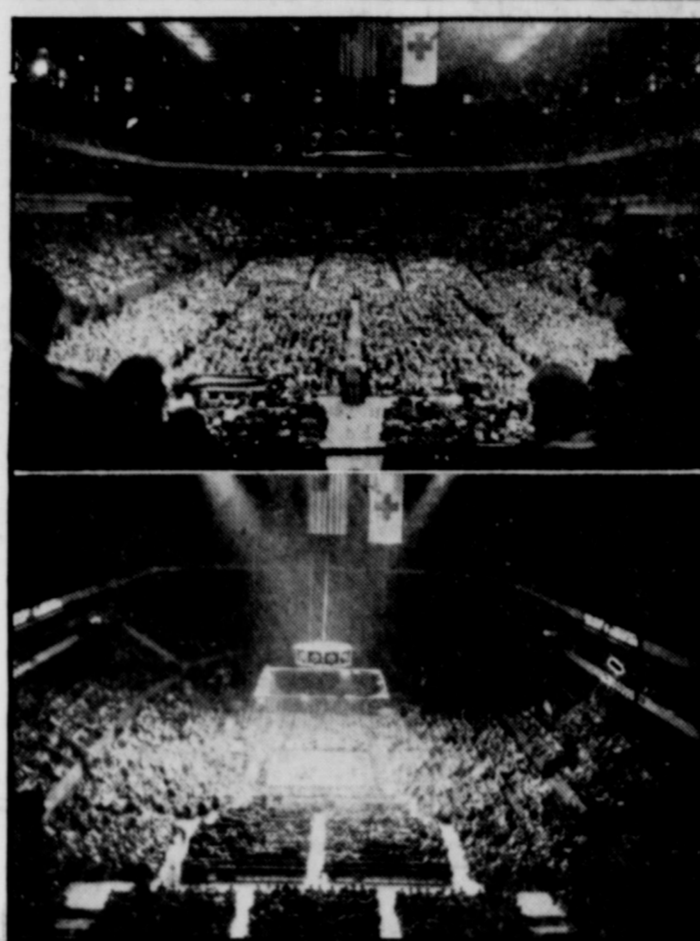

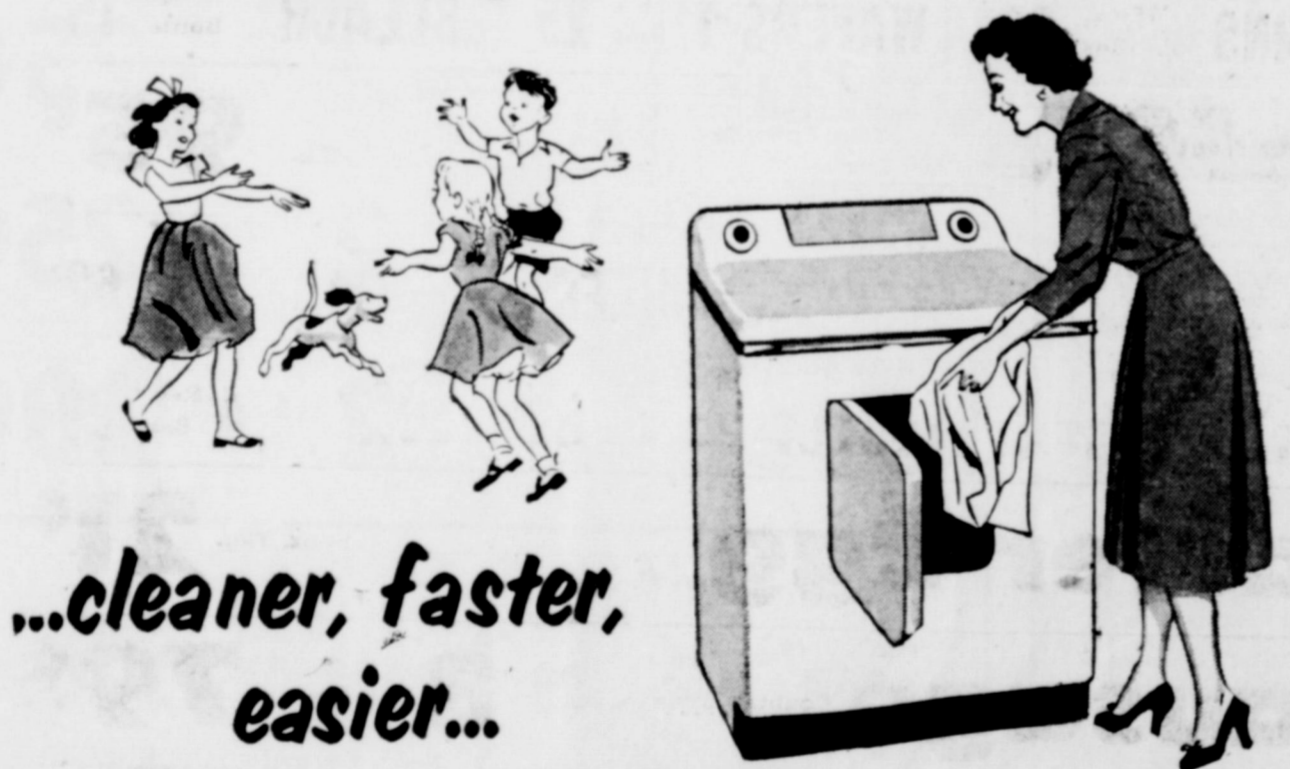

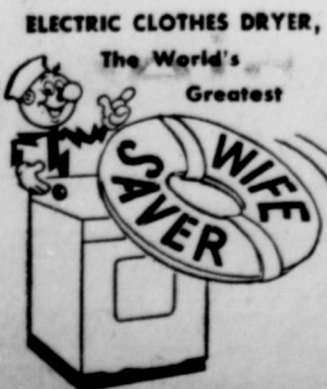
