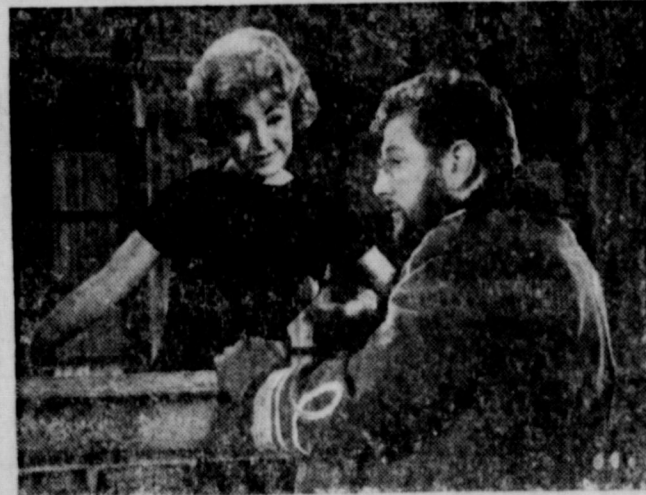
Twelve Members Attend Meeting of WMU

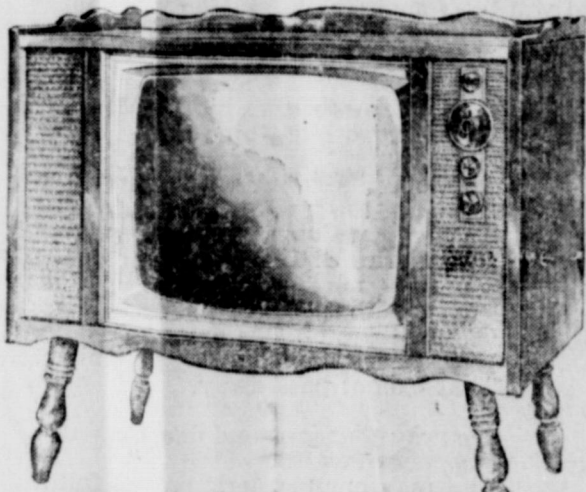
