

Plant Diseases Can Cut Livesock Grain and Profit

COLLEGE STATES prevention and contil of plant diseases are importar in livestock production because ofits depend on maximum yield from pastures and crops.

In many instares, says Harlan E. Smith, exter on plant pathologist, the wearer, soil or planting seed get re blame for low production win plant diseases cause the loss. Too, he adds, poor quality feer or forage often results from amages caused by plant disees. Such feed does not contain t vitamins, minerals and other es atials necessary for good animal alth, says the pathologist.

The ungi, bacteria and other germ which cause plant diseases anche seen with the naked eve. An plant diseases are difficult or ssible to control once they infected a crop. However, s Smith, many can be prevent-. For example, the treating of lanting seed with a good fungiide will aid in controlling some feed and forage crop diseases.

The pathologist suggests that good, carefully selected seed which dry, sound and free from comne injured seed coats be planted. Also that the seed be planted in a varm, mellow soil. Cold and wet oil favors seedling diseases.

He recommends that rotation be ollowed with annual feed and forage crops because growing the me crop on the same land year after year tends to increase plant disease problems.
