Again this year, as in the past, patrons of the local Interstate Theatres will be permitted to pit their skill and judgment against that of the members of the Motion Picture of Arts and Sciences, in selecting the winners of eight of the categories which are to be awarded Oscars at the annual Academy Awards affair in Hollywood.

The city manager of the local Interstate Theatres, Aubrey Van Hoy, made the announcement, and stated that official Sweepstakes ballots will be available at Majestic Theatre, through April 3, for the duration of the Sweepstakes period, and that all pertinent information concerning the nominations for the various classifications will be contained on the ballot.

Also on the program will be an original work, "Grecian Theme and Dance, written especially for Maurice McAdow and the NTSC Concert Band by the Grecian composer, John Cacavas. Another composition to be played will be a Spanish march, "El Conquistador," written by James L. Tarver and dedicated to the band and McAdow.

During the past decade, a number of original compositions have been written for the NTSC Concert Band. McAdow has included as many as possible of the original works in the college band library. On the 1960 tour, some of the originals performed will be "Pageant" by Persichetti, "La Fiesta Mexicana" by Reed, "Tulsa" by Gillis, and "An Original Suite" by Jacob.

McAdow joined the college faculty in 1945 and has built the concert band into one of the outstanding student musical organizations on the campus. Concerts have been performed in Texas, Arkansas, Mississippi, Louisiana, Tennessee, Illinois, Missouri, Oklahoma, Alabama, South Carolina, and Kentucky.

## I GIVE YOU TEXAS

Did you ever attend "amateur night" in an old-time vaudeville theater? I did several times in the Star Theater in Memphis.

Amateur night was, as I recall, on Friday nights and anyone could enter-but he did so at his peril. Those who could sing, dance or play a musical instrument had an opportunity to appear before an audience and a chance to win one of the cash prizes.

The house was packed and the audience was the judge. Those that the crowd liked, they applauded. If they didn't like a performer, they would boo, hoot and even pelt with peanuts. But the most cruel form of disapproval was the cry of "Get the hook!"

Nevertheless, I once took part. Well, I was not a performer. I was what you might call the promoter or producer of an act. It came about in this way:

I was in the eighth grade at Prescott (now Guthrie) School and lived on Chelsea. Next door were twin brothers, several years younger than I, named Harry and Harold. I was the owner of a set of boxing gloves so I said to the twins, "Why don't you and him fight on amateur night?"

Since this was not to be a real fight but an act, I felt a little rehearsing was in order, so I said, "Harry, you will win the first round; Harold, you will win the second round; the third and final round, you are on your own."

We reported at the alley door of the theater and were admitted back stage. When the time came for the bout, the sight of brother against brother appealed to the crowd. All went well in the first round, which was won by Harry, as agreed. The second round however, Harold got a little too vigorous and knocked Harry down. Up the batter bounced and tore into his brother. Harold gave punch for punch and the crowd roared. The bell rang but they still stood toe-to-toe, slugging until the assistant stage-manager, who was the referee, halted it.

They won second prize, which was \$5. As I recall, I gave them half. After all, I had thought up the idea, furnished the gloves and wrote the script.

**IS IT POSSIBLE FOR ME TO KNOW GOD?**

"I am a sinner and I've got to find God," a woman said as she was about to leave the church. The pastor invited her to a corner pew. He suggested prayer and began to pray, asking God to help the woman be willing to repent of every sin and to accept Jesus Christ as her Saviour. He then asked her to pray. She did so.

In a moment there came a change in the tone of her voice and she ended her prayer thanking God for the peace and satisfaction which had come to her heart even as she prayed.

While the two prayed together in the rear of the auditorium, the buzz of conversation ceased. The minister supposed that everyone had left. But when he stood he saw a dozen other people here and there in silent prayer. They were faithful members of the church who saw their pastor was witnessing for Christ and who went voluntarily to prayer for the stranger seeking help. This incident is an illustration of the conviction held by Baptists that all men who sincerely desire may truly reach God in prayer.

With Baptists, there is no certain place nor certain time nor certain position for prayer. Baptists believe Jesus when he said: "Him that cometh to I will in no wise cast out" (John 6:37).
