**Former Eastland Lawyer Retires Recently In Austin at Age of 69**

(Editors Note: The following story features Mrs. Minnie Robey, who at one time practiced law in Eastland. It recently appeared in Austin American.)  
 Johnson County still hasn't forgotten it . . .  
 The sight of a sprightly young girl kicking dust along country roads with her purple-topped buggy in an unheard of bid for votes in 1912 when the thought of a female-marked ballot was 10 degrees left of socialism. And treasures of Johnson County.  
 Mrs. Minnie Robey didn't make the trip to the tall books in the county courthouse. But, she tossed away the dusty tome less energetic young ladies had been living by for years, and she's been having what folks today call "a ball" ever since.  
 Friday she could look back on "almost 60 years of getting up early and sally forth in the kinds of weather with the kind of smile you get only when everything has gone right. A young-acting "almost 70," Mrs. Robey retired after 11 years as docket clerk and reporter for the State Industrial Accident Board.  
 "That county treasurer's job sure looked good to me then," Mrs. Robey recalls. "It paid \$150 a month—which was a fortune in 1912. And the \$40 I was making as secretary in a Cleburne law firm didn't go far at home. I guess I should have been stopped by the fact women couldn't even vote then. But, I ran and I lost and it was a lot of fun."  
 Her one grab at the political brass ring packed into memories, Mrs. Robey ironed the wrinkles out of another new pattern: She

was the first woman from West Texas to pass the state bar exam and practice law.  
 Married to Charles C. Robey of Greenville, a young assistant in the US attorney's Dallas office, Mrs. Robey began to look at those thin shelves of thick books with a new interest.  
 "We moved to Eastland during the big Ranger oil boom—to practice law and make a lot of money. Well, we made a lot of good friends instead of money—which was even better."  
 "One of the lawyers there began giving a few lectures at night. Between reading the books in my husband's office and listening to everything that boy said, I came to Austin and passed the test."  
 Although she never carried the intense, harried look of the courtroom defender, Mrs. Robey was an active partner in her husband's Eastland firm until his death in 1934.  
 An Austin resident since 1939, Mrs. Robey was secretary to the appellate division of the Attorney General's office eight years. She joined the Industrial Accident Board staff in 1947.  
 A charter member of the Federated Business and Professional Woman's Club, she also was a past president of the University Methodist Church Wesleyan Service Guild and an honorary member of Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority.  
 "What about tomorrow?"  
 "You know, right now I'm just looking forward to that one morning when I wake up to the beat of rain on the roof and know it's cold outside. I'm going to open one eye, close it quick, roll over for the first time in almost 60 years—and go back to sleep."
