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Pampan Receives Degree at Mexico City University

MEXICO CITY—John E. McConnell, son of Mr. and Mrs. R. S. McConnell, received his Bachelor of Arts degree in Latin American Culture from Mexico City College on June 5.

McConnell is the grandson of the late Maggie Hopkins, well-known Panhandle pioneer. He was active in the dramatic and musical organizations of Pampa High School; from which he graduated in 1939. The following year he entered the University of Texas and was elected to Phi Eta Sigma, honorary scholastic society, in his freshman year.

McConnell next attended Georgetown University, Foreign Service School. Here he was the winner of the J. Nevils Coleman Award for outstanding work of the year in foreign relations. This is the highest award given to an undergraduate.

As a member of the Army Specialized Training Program, he was directed to Queens College to continue his education. McConnell joined the U. S. Army on Feb. 15, 1943, and served in the 69th Infantry Division until Dec. 17, 1946. He received a battlefield commission while in the European Theater. While overseas he also attended the Heidelberg University, Germany.

Deciding to get a first-hand knowledge of the Spanish language and Latin American Culture, he then enrolled in Mexico City College. He now speaks two languages, German and Spanish.

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

Scripture: 11 Kings 22:10, 11; 23:15, 21

One of the mysteries of life is why good men sometimes have evil sons. However, it is a compensating fact that sometimes evil men have very good sons.

Both facts are strikingly illustrated in the history of the kings of Judah who came after Hezekiah. Hezekiah, as we have seen, was a relatively good king, and his long reign was marked by safety and prosperity. Included was the remarkable university which the Hebrews and Assyrians destroyed and turned back by the plague that struck their camp as they were about to overwhelm Judah.

But the impressive influences of that deuteronomy were soon forgotten in the long reign of Hezekiah's son, Manasseh, who was a corrupt and evil king. It is recorded that he not only shed innocent blood, but that he sought to overthrow and destroy the religion of Israel.

He set up altars and practices of idolatry and turned to all methods of sorcery and abominable practices. His son, Amon, proved no better, becoming king at the age of 22, but he sought to overthrow and destroy the religion of Israel.

Then came the good son of a bad father. The conspirators against Amon were themselves slain by those who sought Josiah, Amon's son, then a boy of 8, and made him king. He ruled for 31 years, and his reign was marked by good influences from the first, for as boy and man he was a God-fearing and well-intentioned man, and he sought to overthrow and destroy the religion of Israel.

Dionne Quints Now 13, Should Live to Be 50

NEW YORK, N. Y.—As the Dionne quintuplets on May 28th passed their 13th birthday the chances are better than ever that they will all live to celebrate their 50th anniversary together, statisticians of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company calculated. The final survivor of the group may expect to live to age 86.

The chances are about 95 in 100 that all five girls will reach their maturity, about 65 in 100 that they will all attain age 45, and more than 20 in 100 that they will all live to celebrate their 65th birthday.

The figures are based on the average for girls in the general population of Canada. The statisticians point out that with the special care the world-famous quintuplets are receiving, the prospects are that they will exceed the average.

"As continued progress in life conservation is made," the statisticians comment, "the chances of survival for the quintuplets will increase. Since the quintuplets were born the joint expectation of life at age 13 for five girls in Canada has increased by more than five years."
