## MATURE PARENT

This summer Mr. B.'s vacation was a visit to his family. None of its members had ever seen his younger child. At first everyone enthused over Buddy. Later they decided that he was "spoiled." And began to say so with increasing irritation.

Mr. B. writes me: "The child got out of control because he was overstimulated by too much adult attention. But my husband can't see it. He says that we have been too 'soft' with both the children. He has become so critical of them since we got home that they are growing afraid of him."

I guess Mr. B.'s family hurt him. Is he going to hold on to the bruise? Isn't he going to do any work at all to recover his original joy in his children?

## MATURE PARENT

My littles toe is an insignificant, weak thing compared to Mr. B. Last week I stubbed it. It became angry, swelled to twice its size, and protested my cruelty in an infuriated black and purple bruise.

I gave it no assistance whatever. Yet two days later that smallest toe of mine had entirely recovered its original size, pinkness — and was going cheerfully about its business.

To Mr. B. I commend the efficiency with which that toe registered, protested and disposed of its hurtful experience.

Sometimes I wonder if we are not unworthy of bodies. When someone seeks to enhance his prestige by attacking us, we cling to our bruise for days, weeks, years.

Unlike my smallest toe, we do not register that we have been attacked. We don't make our protest clear, even to ourselves. Instead we have to hold on to the congestion and confusion imposed by the attack.

Bodies have unlimited wisdom. How truthful they are when they are angry! Yet how quickly they settle down to pull together the cut that interferes with their wholeness.

Why, our bodies' treatment of a burn has more to tell parents than all the experts lumped together. How tenderly it maintains the burn's blister until it is certain that the young untried skin beneath is sure enough of itself to take over! Always, the moment for its independence is precisely known.

But we, our bodies' scornful and arrogant masters, get bruised on a summer holiday and come home to make everyone around us miserable.

## Explosion Kills Three, Hurts 23

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 29—UP—Three firemen were killed and 23 were injured, five of them seriously, Thursday when a 4,000-gallon chemical tank exploded in the rear of a North Philadelphia factory.

The dead were battalion chief John J. News, 61, and John G. Magrann, 60, and Deputy Chief Thomas A. Kline, 58, who headed the firemen summoned to the scene when neighbors in the area complained of chemical fumes.

The tank was located in the rear of the two-story plant of the Charles W. Berg laboratories, manufacturers of chemicals and oils.

## Escapee Brothers To Face Trial

**MANGUM, OKLA., Oct. 29—UP—**Norman and Chester Davenport will be tried in district court at Mangum in the term starting Monday for their escape last year

from the Granite, Okla., state reformatory.

Norman, 25, also is charged with armed robbery and kidnaping a guard. Judge W. P. Keen said he probably would be tried first, on the kidnaping charge, beginning Monday.

Chester, 31, escaped during a baseball game. He finally was recaptured at Dixon, Calif., where he was working on a dairy farm, last Jan. 7, two weeks after Nor-

man was picked up on a train between Dallas and Fort Worth.

Chester was on the Federal Bureau of Investigation's list of the 10 most wanted criminals in the nation when he was captured.

The Davenport brothers are natives of Wichita Falls and were serving 25 years for the kidnap robbery of an Oklahoma highway patrolman when they made their separate escapes.

4. In 1952 you publicly supported Adlai Stevenson in spite of a directive from your own people - and the Democratic Party of the State of Texas - to support Mr. Eisenhower. This - in spite of the fact that you knew that the National Democratic Party and their candidate for President, Adlai Stevenson, had vowed to take the Texas tidelands away from Texas. IS THIS TRUE, MR. ROGERS?

Mr. Rogers, these are hard, cold facts from sources that are a matter of public record. I first asked you these questions publicly on October 21st, because I felt that you should have an opportunity to answer the questions for the voters and taxpayers of this area.

MAY WE HAVE YOUR ANSWER, MR. ROGERS?
