

An executive of a leading oil company recently wrote an article with the vivid title, "A Heck of a Way to Run a Manapoly." In the course of it he described some things the oil men have failed to do.

They have failed to keep enterprising newcomers out of the industry.

They have failed to divide up the market. They have failed to keep oil prices high.

They have failed to make aigantic profits.

They have failed to squeeze small business out of the

industry. They have failed to keep new and better oil products off the market.

That's quite a list. It details the kind of failures that are absolutely inevitable in any competitive enterprise. If there was anything even resembling a monopoly in oil, none of those failures could or would have occurred.

Another point of interest is that the industry is currently spending the huge sum of \$125,000,000 a year on research for better products. To a monopoly this would be ridiculous and unthinkable. Monopolies never are interested in progress. They don't have to be. For the customer has to take what is offered, at whatever price the monopoly fixes, or go without.

Oil, in sum, is among the most competitive enterprises.

Water comes out of the earth just as oil does. But water is much more abundant, much easier to find. We use more water - but there is more water than ail. Water wells cost much less than oil wells. Yet, strange as it seems we have a shortage of water

In the same Western areas that boast an abundance of oil and gas.

Maybe water should be competitive, too. Maybe if water companies were run in the same way

oil companies are run, instead of being dominated by government companies, we'd be up to our necks in water . . and the competition would make it cheap, too.

Why is this? In an oil or gas company the emphasis Is put on exploration. They are always searching for a new source of supply.

Oil companies compete. They don't wait for rain. They go after their supply ten years in advance.

Sound Money Means Better Jobs

I want to continue to quote from Ludwix Von Mises' book "The Theory of Money and Credit," Under the chapter headed "Monetary

"The market economy or capiand political parties. Educational institutions, from universities down to kindergartens, the press, the radio, the legitimate theatre as well as the screen, the publishing firms are almost completemost ghastly of all evils."

That is about what this column has been saying. Of course, our educational institutions have been controlled by the state and the very fact that they are controlled by the state is proof that free market education and a free market economy are regarded as impractical and thus evil.

Von Mises continues in this manner:

"The goal of their policies is to substitute 'planning' for the alleged planlessness of the market economy. The term 'planning' as they use it means, of course, central planning by the authorities, enforced by the police power. It implies the nullification of each citizen's right to plan his own life." Public schools deny the child and the parents the right to plan their own lives. The local school boards are losing their right to plan to the state and to the federal government. They are losing it by the police power.

Von Mises continues: "It converts the individual citizens into mere pawns in the schemes of the planning board, whether it is called Politburo, or some other name. Planning does not differ from the social system that Marx advocated under the name of socialism and communism. It transfers control of all production activities to the government and thus eliminates the market altogether. Where there is no market, there is no money either."

Would that the members of the Planning Boards and the City insist that they have the right to plan how individuals use their own property would read pages 459 in Ludwig von Mises' great book "The Theory of Money and Credit." 


