### Moveland At Its Shining Best For Birthday Party

HOLLYWOOD (UP) — Moveland was at its shining best last week when Jerry Lewis rounded up a group of TV stars to help celebrate the ninth birthday of "Little Boy Blue," who is dying of muscular dystrophy in a Massachusetts sanatorium.

But the story behind Lewis' attempt to cheer the stricken youngster on his last birthday is as heartwarming as the show he put on.

It goes like this:

UP Story Has Reaction  
United Press set of a chain reaction when it ran a story from Boston last week telling about the lonesome boy who, for four months, had no visitors or mail. "Francis X," as he is called by the nurses, was alone in the world. His father is in prison for killing his mother.

The story came to Jerry's attention. The comedian decided to put together a closed circuit TV program for Francis. Lewis heads the muscular dystrophy campaign each year.

First he called David Sarnoff, boss man of NBC-TV and RCA in New York. Sarnoff agreed to provide the cable time for the project. Next Jerry began lining up talent for the 45-minute show.

In less than 12 hours he corralled Eddie Fisher and George Gobel—both of whom were rehearsing for their own network shows.

The word went out. Dinah Shore also busy putting together a show of her own, volunteered to sing a song, as did Mary Costa. Eddie Cantor joined the rush, and Jerry had a major production on his hands.

Gets More Time  
He asked Sarnoff for another half-hour of time — and got it. Then Hugh O'Brian (TV's Wyatt Earp) agreed to say hello to Francis and demonstrate his fancy gun twirling.

Talullah Bankhead, sophisticated and wise, asked if she could help, too. Jerry thanked her, but said Francis was a little young for her brand of entertaining. Talullah, near tears, departed.

Disney Chips In  
The show's success was insured when Disney's Mouseketeers rushed over before their own shows to entertain young Francis. Pinky Lee, an old trouper at entertaining small fry, donned his crazy cap and checked out to dance and prance for "Little Boy Blue" and his friends and the sanatorium. An 18-piece band provided the music.

Unions, management, technicians, producers, big shots and "little people" donated time and money to the "party." And it was a pip.

After it was over Lewis, perspiring from his efforts, thanked his co-workers. He said "It's awfully difficult to be funny with a lump in your throat. But it's a birthday party none of us will ever forget."

### WACs Pass 'Shape Up' Inspection

CAMP KISHINE, Japan (UP) — A freshly-shackled Yokohama WAC detachment passed a critical "shape up" inspection today with both official and non-official judges agreed that all the curves were in the right places.

# Reds' Economic Troubles Mount

East Germany's sudden exchange of old currency for new is a sign of mounting economic trouble in the Communist world.

Officially, the exchange was made necessary because West German "monopolists and militarists" were using the East German mark for speculation in currency and for espionage.

Actually, the switch is likely to mean a gigantic repudiation of the old currency which will cost East Germans billions of dollars.

Under the currency switch which the East German puppet government announced without previous warning, the country's 18 million people were permitted to exchange 300 marks in old currency for 300 marks in the new currency.

All old currency above 30 marks is to be put into bank accounts which, officially, will be credited to holders of the old currency.

But in the first place, the East German mark is worth only a fraction of its official value. It is supposed to be equal in value to the West German mark, which is worth 24 cents. Actually, it took four East German marks to buy one West German mark.

It is quite likely to develop that East Germans never will get back more than 300 marks' worth of their money. For there is a little-remembered law in East Germany forbidding any person to hold more than 300 marks in currency.

The statement that the change was made necessary by the speculative and espionage activities of West Germans is an obvious fiction. It is estimated that the total of East German marks held in West Berlin, the chief exchange market, was only about one mil-
