This is Pampa's first community campaign for a not-for-profit institution.

Our community is being asked to act on the findings of the study and survey made among students of Pampa's Junior and Senior High Schools: The Youth Activity and Interest Survey.

It was shown that 52% of the boys and girls do not take part in local youth group activities. "There is evidence" the survey asserted "of a need to expand . . . youth programs."

The students ranked an indoor swimming pool as their greatest recreational need. A youth and community center was their next choice. Their next expressed needs, all of which the Center plans to fill, included a canteen, tennis, hobby facilities, badminton, & a social club.

The ten-acre site at Kentucky and Harvester streets provides ample space for those activities and anticipates the growth of Pampa in area and population. Parents will approve the location because it is away from the undesirable influences of certain downtown adult recreation places.

Due to the matching of \$153,000 from Mrs. Inez Carter, every Community Campaign dollar is a dollar-and-a-half contribution, and every dollar contributed will be used for the Center. All campaign expenses are and will be met from the Carter gift.

The Center will provide recreational and social facilities for adults at hours not conflicting with the youth schedules. The small fee for these activities, and the income from the Carter gift, will meet operation charges.

This is a one-time, capital funds campaign: that is, the Community Campaign funds are to be used for new construction, new equipment, not to meet operating expenses. It is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity.

Due to clean government and the wholesome atmosphere of home, church and school, Pampa is blessed with minimum juvenile delinquency. The Youth and Community Center will be a constant, living, constructive force to keep it low.

HOW YOU CAN GIVE

The needed goal of \$300,000 is not a large sum for the growing, progressive city of Pampa to invest in its future citizens, but to obtain this sum will require more than nominal giving.

Givers set their own manner of giving over the three-year period. Cash gifts are most welcome but not to the exclusion of being limited to a single year.

A cash gift this year sets the pace for pledges for the next two years. These can be met at the giver's option — monthly, quarterly, semi-annually, yearly. When spread over 36 months, pledges have the benefit of income tax deductions over four tax-years.

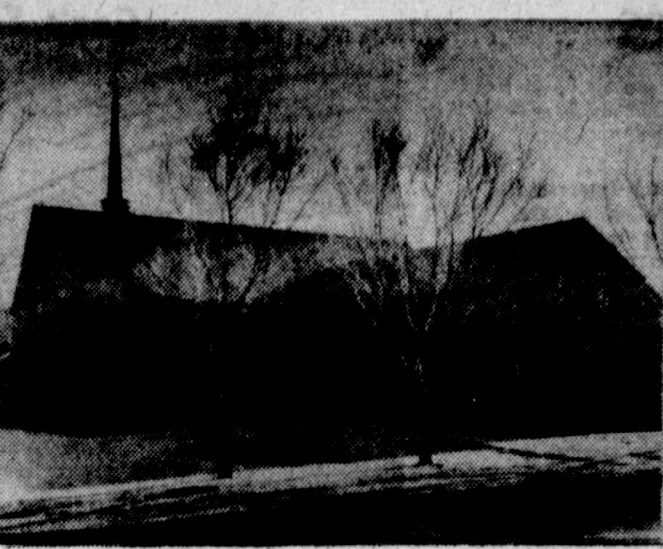

WHAT MAKES A VOCATION CHRISTIAN?

When is a vocation Christian? How may one know if what he is doing is work in which he may fulfill God's will for his life? These are questions every Christian must decide for himself. However there is a standard below which it would seem that no Christian could work without very serious heart searching. Here is a real test that will determine if your vocation is one in which a Christian can serve.

1. One must be honest.
A Christian's vocation must be one in which the person can be honest. It is difficult to believe that God would call one to a place of service where dishonesty was required in order to hold a job. God may call one to a place in which he will be tempted to be dishonest. Temptation is not sin, but yielding to the temptation is sin.
2. One must be useful.
A Christian's vocation must be one of service. God does not call his children to useless, unproductive, futile tasks. There is work to be done, work that will help and not hurt, build up, not tear down, strengthen and not weaken. How can any Christian believe that God calls him into or will look with favor upon his being engaged in traffic in dope, in gambling, in the sale or distribution of alcoholic beverages, any form of crime, or anything that will tear down the moral fiber of any person.
3. One must treat people with Christian consideration.
In a Christian's vocation one must treat people as end, not as a means to an end. A Christian vocation is one in which it is possible for one to treat every person as a person for whom Christ died.
4. God can bless it.
A Christian's vocation must be one which he can conscientiously ask God's blessings upon and he can ask Him to bless him in his vocation. Edgar Frank has expressed it well in the following poem:

A man I know has made an altar
of his factory-bench,
And one has turned the counter in his store
Into a place of sacrifice and holy ministry.
Another still has changed his office-desk
Into a pulpit-desk, from which to speak and write,
Transforming commonplace affairs
Into the business of the King.
A Martha is our midst has made
Her kitchen-table a communion-table
A postman makes his daily round
A walk in the temple of God.
To all of these each daily happening
Has come to be a whisper from the lips of God,
Each separate task a listening-post
And every common circumstance
A wayside shrine.

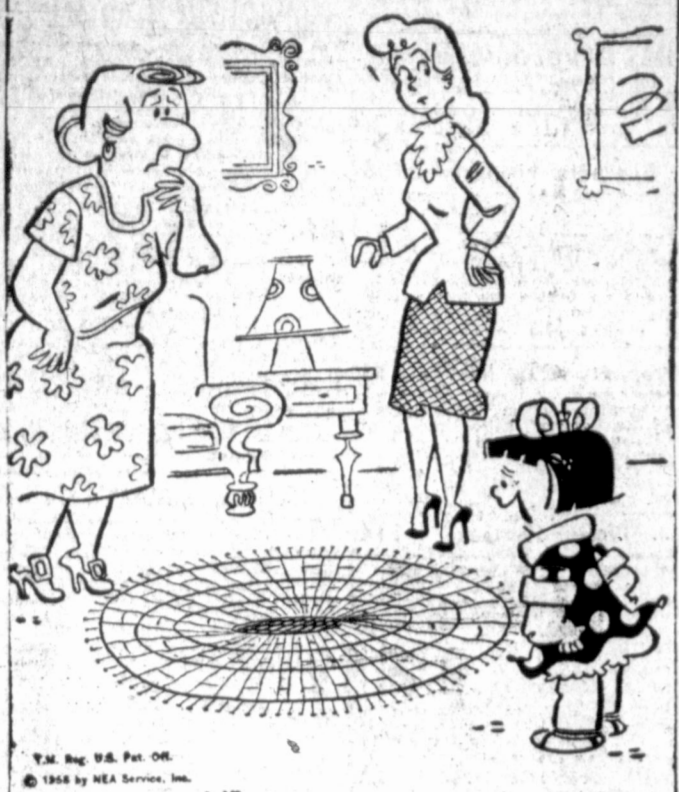
