An Interview With Students Studying To Be Teachers

Recently Mike Lyons, who is attending Orange County S. 3 College at Fullerion, Calif., telaphoned me that he would like to bring a tape recorder and a couple of other prospective teachers to interview me on my ideas of education. He said they wanted to use the tape recording in their

I told him I was perfectly willing to be interviewed and answer questions, provided they would answer questions. He said that would be fair. But they did not make a tape recording of my questions to them, only a tape recording of their questions to me. I want to report the questions

they asked and my answers: First student: 1. "How do you feel the schools are doing in presenting the fundamental subjects, i.e., the three R's in our present school system?"

My answer: "Some places might be doing all right. Others not very good. And I don't think the fundamental subjects should be limited to the three R's. It's not a good question because there are much more fundamental questions than the three R's".

First student: "I think we'll cover the other subjects later, Mr. Hoiles. What we meant by the three R's were reading, writing and arithmetic. No. 3 we'll go to

3. "It is a common charge that the modern school is taking over duties that properly belong in the home. These charges generally mention physical health and emotional problems. What is your opinion on this? I think this is adding to your three R's. Do you agree with me, Mr. Hoiles?'

My answer: "When you talk about schools you are talking about tax-supported schools? 1 would rather my children couldn't read and write than not know the difference between right and wrong. Teaching everybody to be able to read and write and not teaching them the difference between right and wrong has changed the whole course of liter-
