

Worst Accident Of Year In State

LUBBOCK, Tex. (UPI) -Seven of-eight occupants of two cars died Sunday night in the worst Texas highway accident of the year at an intersection five miles south of

The eighth - 8-year-old Carl R. Milliken - underwent brain surgery later and was in critical condition at Methodist Hospital.

One of the demolished cars was driven by 15-year-old Walter Taylor of Wolforth, Tex. He and the driver of the other car, Doyle Dean Tucker, 27, of Lubbock, were listed among the dead.

The other victims were Tucker's wife, Shirley, 22, and their son Darrell, 4; John Clinton Miliken, 22, of Slaton, Tex., and Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Milliken, 65 and 58, of Slaton

The Millikens were riding in the car driven by Taylor. The Tucker family was in the other

N. K. Woerner of the Texas Department of Public Safety said the accident was the worst of the year in the state.

Taylor's car was going east on FM 1585. When the cars collided, they careened into a utility pole and snapped it off near the ground. The vehicles ended up as battered wreckage in a ditch, Darrel Tucker apparently was the only victim who lived after the accident. But, he was dead on arrival at a hospital later.

"The lack of resistance to the evils of inflation - the lack of a national will power to rally against the financial rot - was due, in part (in part only!) to the fact that many people profited by inflation. To be more precise: they thought they profited. Ignorance of the ultimate consequences, promoted by the hysterical fear of another great economic depression, was an important element in the psychological picture.

Depend on America "Equally important was the sentiment that America would never let the French down, whatever foolish path France might follow, and the belief that inflation guaranteed for France a rapid industrial growth - an 8 to 10 per cent annual increase, between 1948 and 1957, of the gross

"The inflationary process in a modern economy is a highly complex financial and psychological interplay of mutually supporting and reinforcing vicious circles The process comes to an end if the fundamental 'mechanism' the monetization of debt - is stopped, as it has to stop if the currency is redeemable in gold, But the redeemability of the French franc was suspended on Aug. 2, 1914; it has remained suspended, de facto or de jure, to this day (excepting the six-year period of stability, 1928-1934). So, the politicians enjoyed the freedom to please the voters by generosity, the check to be picked up by the taxpayers, the holders of money claims, and other innocent bystanders. A continuously expanding monetary base invited the expansion of bank deposits. This swelling flood of purchasing power sparked the inflationary expectations which in turn were instrumental in revolu-






