Mrs. Dorothy Lester, mission-humorist with the Board of National Missions of the United Methodist Church, will be the featured speaker at a Thanksgiving dinner in the First Presbyterian Church Thursday. The dinner, which is sponsored by the Mariners Club of the church, will be held 7 p.m. in Fellowship Hall.

Mrs. Lester, of Fort Smith, Ark., director of the Enlarged Parish of the Arkansas Valley Presbytery, is a parish which includes two white churches, 14 Choctaw churches and 19 colored churches. Mrs. Lester prepares materials for use in the various departments of the church and holds training sessions for the church leaders in the area that makes up her parish.

In 1954, Mrs. Lester was named Kansas Woman of the Year. The following year, Beta Sigma Phi conferred on her "the award of Jewels Degree and the National Honorary Degree. It is the first time an Arkansas woman has been so honored.

In November 1958, she was elected President of the National Presbyterian Town and Country Fellowship. This also marks the first time a woman has been elected to that position.

Mrs. Lester has contributed to national and denominational magazines and has worked with radio and television presentations at Butler University, Indianapolis, Ind.

Following the dinner, Mr. and Mrs. S. P. Caldwell will give a devotional. The Rev. Ronald E. Hubbard, pastor of the church, will introduce the speaker.

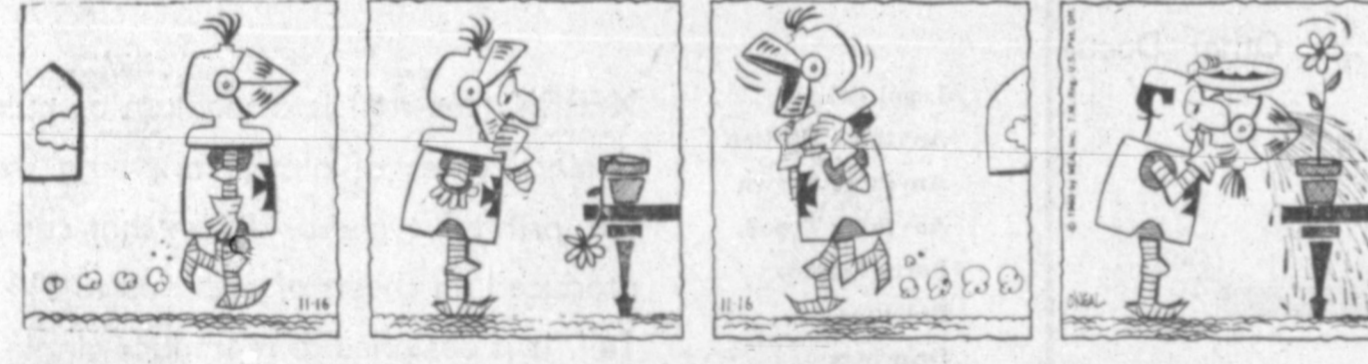

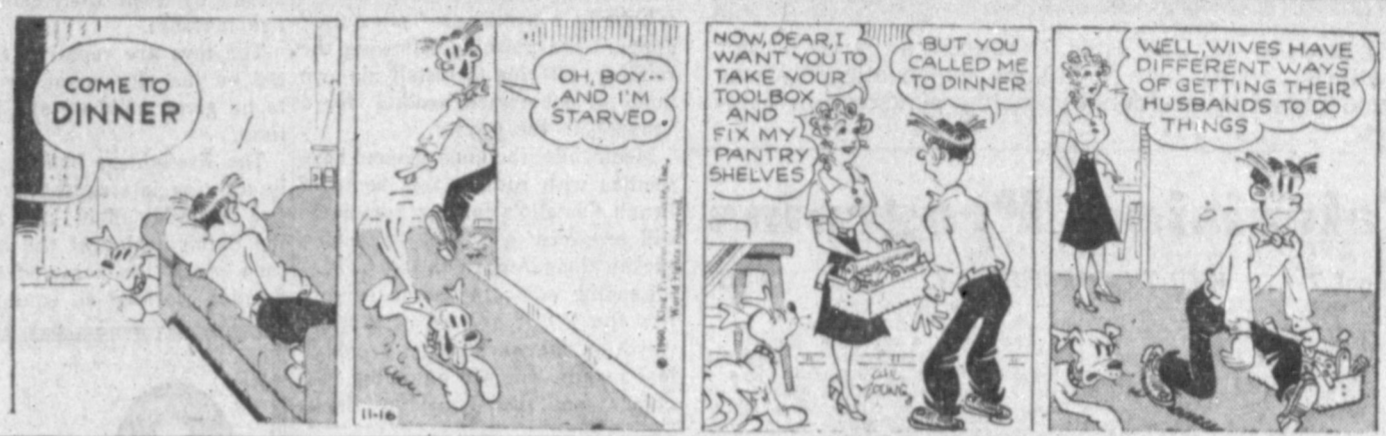

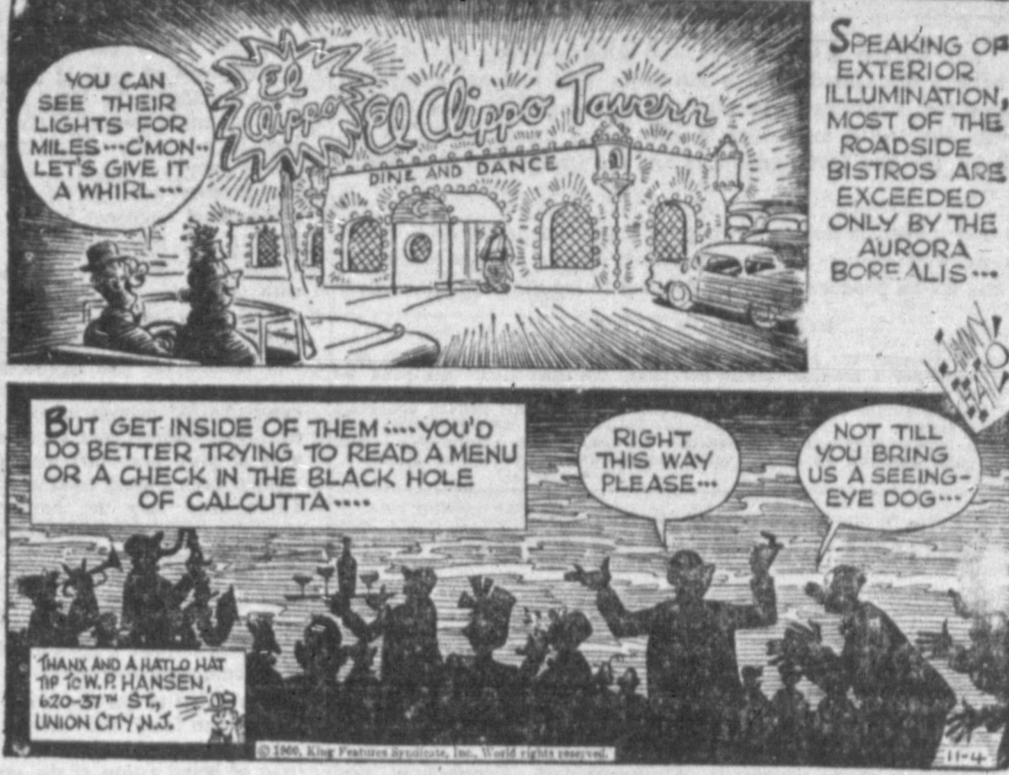
