







About 80,000 workers in the meat packing industry will receive two-cent hourly raises. Another 79,000 in the aircraft industry will get a penny or two-cents an hour more, and 40,000 in a variety of industries will get

penny an hour raise. Arnold Chase, Labor Department price chief, said that despite the fractional increase last month the buying power of the consumer's dollar remained un-

creases in food costs in the months ahead, but said the index may balance off because of further declines in new car prices and some grocery costs.

He held out some hope for possible drop in overall living costs next fall.

The church purchased a 3-bedroom home for the pastor in 1956 and began a fund raising campaign to build a new auditorium. Harris resigned in November,


