STATE OF THE ATOM-How close is the nation to making the atom its prime power source? Newsmap above shows there are three nuclear power plants in operation. Last year they produced 65,000 killowatts of electricity. But this was only a tiny fraction of the 112 million killowatts generated by steam and 12.5 million by water. A handful of other plants are in design or constructions stages in nine states (California, South Dakota, Illinois, Michigan, Florida, South Carolina, Pennsylvania, New York and Massachusetts) and will be joined by more and more in the 1960s. Unless there is a breakthrough in technology, however, the prediction is that nuclear power will still constitute but a small part of the nation's total elec-trical output for the rest of this century. 





THE TREASURED RIGHT TO WORK

At stake in the presidential election is the economic as well as the political future of the South, The foundation stone of the eco-nomic progress that has taken place in the Southern region in recent years has been the rightto-work concept which has been endorsed by many states in the South. Industrial leaders, planning new factories have recognized in the South a climate of industrial peace. They have had assurance, by enactment of rightto-work laws, that employes would not become captives of the union bosses who have tyrannized so many plants in other

But right-to-work laws would be abolished if the Democratic Party's platform pledge is car-ried out, which seems certain it that party should win the presidency. Sen. Harry F. Byrd of Virginia, one of the South's most far-seeing spokesmen, recently warned of this grave danger. He served notice in a Senate speech that he would battle any attempt to repeal authorization for rightto-work laws as the Democratic platform promises.

The Taft-Hartley Law specially

authorized states to prohibit any requirement in union contracts that a worker must belong to a labor union to get or hold a job. Such laws, which are known as right-to-work laws, are in force in 20 states. The Democratic platform piedged repeal of this author-

In his statement Sen. Byrd declared he would oppose such a repeal effort "with all my strength and ability . . wherever and whenever the effort is made." Repeal, he said, would be a massive victory for "labor leaders of the stripe we have today." He added: 'Power breeds power, and labor leaders are insatiable in their demands for special privilege and special legislation for immunity. Repeal would be followed by a drive to repeal all protective provisions in the Taft-Hartley Act and other statutes in the whole labor field.'

Referring to the Supreme Court, Sen. Byrd said: "Fulfillment of the Los Angeles pledge would enable the Warren court to strike down all of these state right-towork laws, and freed of the Congressional restriction, I suspect the Warren court would act

Deprived of right-to-work laws, Southern states would be easy game for the Hoffas and Reuthers. Such bosses would send teams of agitators and trouble-makers into every Southern factory and business enterprise, creating civic disorder and social unrest. trial investment in the South would be drastically slowed or halted if the union bosses started a major campaign of intimidation in this region. Investors would be reluctant to launch new enterprise in a prime target area of big unionism. What intensive outside union activity would mean can be understood by recalling the ugly events that took place in Henderson, N.C., last year, Non-strikers were stoned and shot at. Plants were bombed and automobiles turned over. An intensive campaign of labor violence required the calling out of the National

As Sen. Byrd rightly observed, union bosses are greedy for power. They want their domination to extend to each of the 50 states in the union. But the 20 states with right-to-work laws are not in their power. Working men in those states don't have to live in fear of union goons or the leftist politicians who shape union poli-

Right-to-work laws represent a major advance in freedom for Americans. They symbolize the partial return of liberties deprived citizens under the Wagner Labor Law of the New Deal era. No ritizen who values his freedom, who wants to live free of dictaerate threats to right-to-work laws. When these laws of fundamental Americanism are threatened, as they are in the platform written at Los Angeles, an enlightened public will seek to protect them by appropriate action at the polls on election day.




