


Unemployment moved down from 4,017,000 in July to 3,788,000 n August. But because the normal, seasonal shrinkage of 500.000 was not realized, the unemployment rate shot up from 5.4 per cent for July to 5.9 per cent for

This meant that in August 59 of every 1,000 men and women the labor force were out work and looking for jobs.

Most of the 229,000 decline nemployment was the result of teenagers leaving the labor force Unemployment among youngsters 14 to 19 years old dipped by 215,000, but this was about 100,000 less than the department's experts expected.


