Khrush Pounds Table Again

By BRUCE W. MUNN United Press International UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (UPI) Prime Minister Harold Macmillan of Britain defended Secretary General Dag Hammarskjold's Congo policies today and called for increasing U.N. powers in a General Assembly address that touched off another table-pounding tantrum by Nikita Khrushchev

The tantrum degenerated into a shouting and arm-waving demonstration by the Soviet leader when Macmillan referred to Khrushchev's breakup of the Paris summit conference last May.

The display of Russian pyrotechnics was heralded by the silence with which Khrushchev met Macmillan's introduction. All the other delegations applauded warmly. Khrushchev sat silent.






