lke Hits Deficit Theory

Terms Advocates Political Cowards

PHILADELPHIA (UPI)- President Eisenhower today attacked advocates of deficit spending as "political cowards" and said it would endanger U. S. security more than military weakness. The chief executive declared that "nothing can more surely weaken our nation at home and abroad than such irresponsible spending.'

His remarks were a thinly veiled thrust at Democrats. Eisenhower used the same language to denounce Democratic - backed legislative proposals during the last Congress.

He also offered fiscal commandments to preserve a healthy economy, in a speech the 73rd ang nual convention of the American Institute of Certified Public Ac-
