# Pope John XXIII Is Dead

United Press International VATICAN CITY (UPI) - Pope John XXIII, one of the greatest popes in the history of the Roman Catholic Church, died today in the fifth year of his reign.

Te 81-year-old pope went to his death slowly, in prayer and suffering, his stout peasant's heart carrying him through more than three days of final agony that was relieved only by lapses into comas. - Vatican Radio said the Pontiff died at 7:49 p. m. (2:49 p. m.

The spiritual leader of the world's half billion Roman Catholics died without seeing the end of his great project, the Ecumenical Council, which was suspended with his death.

For nearly four days the heart of the Pontiff continued beating after doctors had given up hope of saving him from the stomach tumor that was believed to be ecancerous. As his condition worsened, peritonitis an inflammation of the abdominal cavity, set in and his temperature rose dangerously while his blood pressure fell.

Last Friday he sank so close to death that he asked for and received Extreme Unction, the last rites of the church. As he lingered in the valley of the shadow of death in the days that followed, the Pope slipped in and out of a coma, rallying at times to bless those at his bedside with a weak wave of the hand, then drifting again into deep unconsciousness.

Before the end came he was too weak to move.

Pope John's illness first became evident last November, but he rallied and returned to his work in the Vatican offices until May 21 when the tumor's lethal effects began forcing him into the final surrender

The public saw him for the last time on May 23 when he blessed a cheeding crowd of 15,000 from the window over St. Peter's Square.

The death of the Pope was announced by Giorgio Luigi Dernucci; an editor of the Vatican City newspaper Osservatore Romano. Vatican Radio reported at 3:45 p.m. (10:45 a.m. EDT) that doctors could do nothing more for

It said the Pope had been "unconscious for several hours." "Only his heart is still beating," the broadcast said. "No

feature of his face is moving. He has gone into deep unconsciousness. Administration of oxygen is all that can be done."

At 4:15 p.m. (11:15 a.m. EDT), Msgr. Andrea Cesarano, archbisop of Manfredonia, Italy, left thepapal apartment in tears. Vatican sources said the Pope repeatedly had mentioned his name while half conscious in recent days and that he had been hurriedly summoned to the Vatican from his archdiocese.

The radio had said earlier that the pontiff, although conscious

enough to hear Mass this morning, was so weak he no longer needed sedatives or drugs to kill his pain.

This afternoon's bulletin said the internal hemorrhaging that had complicated his condition earlier had resumed Sunday night. Today his blood pressure dropped from 115 to 95, and medical sources said this indicated his stout heart was failing.

There was no "human" solution to the illness, the Vatican Radio said earlier in the morning.

As the Pope lay dying on his bed in the Vatican Palace, surrounded by his three peasant brothers and sister and his confessor, a group of high church officials charged with the task of (See POPE, Page 3)





To Red Rise in Italy Apprehension is expressed by some that President Kennedy's trip to Europe next month may be the prelude toward further appeasement and concessions for the Soviet. At the time this is written the President's itinerary includes only Italy, Germany and Ireland. The recent general elections in Italy should give Mr. Kennedy pause for serious thought. In that election the communists gained a million votes for a total of nearly 8 million out of 30 million votes cast. That is an alarming situation, but it does not mean that Western Europe is going com-

Three factors have contributed to that situation. First, although northern Italy, the industrial centers, have been prosperous in retent years and reject any communist propaganda, there are millions of poor Italians in the south. They have listened to the promises of the communist agents who tell them that when the "capstalist" class in Italy is deposed all will share in the new wealth of the country. Those Red agents conjure up a New Frontier not deavor - fields in which the proanlike some visionary prosperity that has been dangled before voters in this country.

> A second factor that aided the communist vote was the recent audience given to the son-in-law and daughter of Khrushchev by Pope John XXIII. If he would receive such well known communists, reasoned some of the Italians who are not too well informed, then perhaps they are not as bad as some have pictured them.

> The third contributing factor is the most obvious. For the increase in the communist vote in Italy may be traced directly to the aid given them by our State Department and other bureaus of the government in Washington, On Feb. 24, 1954, the then premier of Italy, Alcide De Gasperi, stated at a news conference in Rome that the new postwar Communist Party "was born and prospered in the Roosevelt climate." It is due entirely to the help given the communists by the Roosevelt-Truman administrations, and let us hasten to add that the Eisenhower administration did nothing to




