# Pittsburgh Will Be Foe Of Huskies In Rose Bowl Tilt

## Panthers Promise to Seek Revenge for Three Beatings

PASADENA, Calif., Dec. 4 (AP)—The University of Pittsburgh and the University of Washington, each with 1936 football records of a slightly checkered design, will meet in the Rose Bowl here New Year's day.

Washington's huskies, host team of the west, tendered Pitt the bid as "representative of the best in eastern football," and said the Panthers promised to seek revenge for the three beatings they received in past performances in the famed bowl.

Athletic Director Ray Eckmann of Washington made the selection announcement, and also made good a pledge that it would be a "surprise."

Up to the last minute, Louisiana State university, Alabama, Navy, Pennsylvania and Pittsburgh remained the leading possibilities for the invitation, with emphasis on L. S. U. and Alabama, whose only blemishes this season were lone tie games.

Coch Jock Sutherland's Panthers have had an unusual season, rolling up 203 points to opponents' 34, winning on occasions when hardly expected, and losing once to a rank shortender.

Pitt ran roughshod over Ohio Wesleyan, 53 to 0, and West Virginia, 34 to 0, and then toppled the unbeaten Ohio State, 6 to 0. Seven days later Duquesne, "Little Giant Killer" of the east, upset the Panthers, 7 to 0.

Pittsburgh turned around and handed Notre Dame its worst defeat in years, a 26 to 0 rout, but the next week was held to a scoreless tie by Fordham.

Penn state fell, 34 to 7, and the Panthers journeyed to Lincoln to set the Nebraska Cornhuskers down, 19 to 6, and ended their season with a 31 to 14 triumph over Carnegie Tech.

Washington, conference champion, lost a 14 to 7 decision to Minnesota in the first game of the season, but defeated in turn Idaho, 22 to 0, U. C. L. A., 14 to 0, Oregon State, 19 to 7, California, 13 to 0, and Oregon, 7 to 0, was tied by Stanford, 14-14, and defeated Southern California 12-0 and Washington State 40-0.

## MAHONEY FORCES ALREADY IN CONTROL OF AAU CONVENTION

### BALL KICKING RULE AROUSES NEW COMMENT

#### PASS INTERFERENCE RULE IS ALSO OPPOSED

NEW YORK, Dec. 4 (AP)—Football crowds in general can take the rules or leave them alone, but the 1936 campaign turned the spotlight on two provisions of the code.

Whether or not the football rules committee does anything about the rules governing interference on forward passing plays, and the kicking, accidental or otherwise, of a free ball, both will serve as excellent material for fireside debate during the off-season.

Larry Kelley, Yale's great end, was responsible for the sudden prominence of the rule forbidding the kicking of a free ball.

In an Associated Press poll leading college gridiron leaders suggested a dozen other changes but most of the comment was on these two provisions.

Article four, section one, rule 10, says a "free ball may not be kicked or kicked at" but a supplementary note adds that no penalty shall be assessed if the ball is kicked "accidentally." In Yale's game with Navy, Kelley kicked a loose ball toward Navy's goal and recovered. The official ruled the ball had been kicked "accidentally" and Yale went on to score the touchdown that won the game, 12-7.

Jack Croft, Montana State coach, pointed out a "clever man can very easily make a kick look accidental and gain a decided advantage by doing so." Charley Bachman of Michigan States thinks the penalty should apply whether the ball is kicked accidentally or not.

The penalty for illegal pass interference by the defending side awards the ball to the opposing team at the spot where the foul was committed as first down, or where the foul occurs in the end zone, on the one-yard line.

Such leaders as Harvey Harman, Tom Thorp, prominent eastern officials, Pop Warner of Temple and Dutch Bergman of Catholic believe the penalty should be cut to 15 yards from the spot of the preceding down. Jimmy Crowley of Fordham and Jack Hagerty of Georgetown agreed the present penalty is "too drastic."

## ARKANSAS PRIMED TO WIN FROM LONGHORNS

(By The Associated Press.)  
The Southwest conference headed down the home stretch of a turbulent campaign today with the University of Arkansas needing only a victory over the University of Texas to win its first championship.

Arkansas' pass-minded Razorbacks will have their chance for the crown in tomorrow's finale with the Texas Longhorns at Little Rock.

Only the Texas Christians had a chance to nose out the Porkers. The Horned Frogs had completed their conference schedule and their hopes rested on a Texas triumph over Arkansas.

A tie game would divide the titular honors between the Razorbacks and Frogs.

Southern Methodist meets Rice at Houston in tomorrow's other conference battle. A victory would give the Mustangs fifth place.

The up-and-down Texas Aggies end their schedule tomorrow against Chick Meehan's Manhattan Jaspers at Tyler.

Coch Homer Norton said he believed the Aggies had recovered from the strain of five games in 26 days and would be in good condition.

Texas Christian, idle this week, completes its schedule against undefeated Santa Clara next week. Baylor finished last Saturday.

HOUSTON, Dec. 4 (AP)—It appeared today at the opening sessions of the annual convention of the Amateur Athletic Union, that Jeremiah T. Mahoney, former New York supreme court justice, would be restored to the presidency, succeeding Avery Brundage of Chicago, on a platform of "harmony and progressive reconstruction."

Whether Mahoney's leadership was sufficiently strong to prevent simmering Olympic issues and criticism of Brundage's management of this year's American international team from reaching the convention floor awaited developments. Committee sessions today will be followed by general meetings tomorrow and Sunday.

Meantime the A. A. U. forces which, under Mahoney's presidency, fought unsuccessfully a year ago to keep the United States out of the Olympic games, on anti-Nazi grounds, appeared to be staging a successful comeback.

On the ground a full day in advance of the rival presidential candidate, Major Patrick J. Walsh of New York, and despite Brundage's support of Walsh, the anti-Olympic forces did a thorough job of button-holing delegates from all parts of the country.

Solid southern support for Mahoney, plus backing from some eastern, mid-western and far western groups, prompted the Mahoney campaign manager, Charles L. Ornstein of New York and Jack Rafferty of Houston, candidate for first vice-president on the anti-administration ticket, to predict they would carry the election by a decisive margin.

Walsh apparently had majority backing from his own metropolitan association, as well as the central association of Chicago and the Missouri Valley, of Kansas City.

Brundage promised to "put all the cards on the table," if the convention insisted on debating such issues as the expulsion of Eleanore Holm Jarrett from the women's swimming team for violation of training rules, the suspension of Jesse Owens for "running out" on a Scandinavian tour after the Olympics, and the failure to start two Jewish sprinters, Sam Stoller and Marty Glickman, on the American 400-meter relay team.

## LANDIS ABOUT READY TO ANNOUNCE RULING

MONTREAL, Dec. 4 (AP)—Commissioner Kenesaw Mountain Landis neared announcement today of his long awaited decision in the case of 17-year-old Bob Feller, sensational Cleveland schoolboy pitcher, and the bigwigs of baseball were actually quaking in their boots.

When Landis first launched all investigation into complaints that Cleveland had violated the major-league agreement by signing Feller off the sandlots, rival club owners hoped the young pitching wonder would be ruled a free agent.

Then they realized that should Landis rule Feller a free agent, he might rule some of their established young stars free agents for the same reason.

Meantime the stupendous "sale of Dizzy Dean" to Cincinnati, Pittsburgh or New York, still was hanging fire.

Another reason for selling is that they are getting set for the Treasury's new financing. Scale-down support is being furnished by institutional investors such as insurance companies, schools and hospitals.

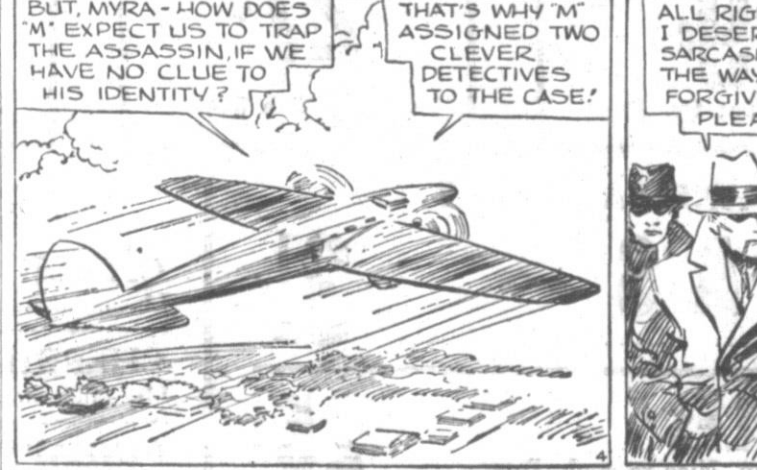
