Two-Inch Snow Brings City White Christmas

Traffic Snarled By Unpredicted Storm

The Pampa area received a wintry Christmas present Friday morning in the form of an estimated two-inch snowfall that snarled traffic and even made walking a hazardous

Winds of 20 to 30 miles per hour piled ridges of one foot and more across streets and sidewalks. While accidents driving. were fortunately few, a number of cars were reported bogged down in various parts of the city. Temperatures stayed in the mid-twenties Friday morning.

The weatherman said that, while the groundcover would hang around to insure a white Christmas for Pampans, conditions in general would be fair and cold for the holiday.

He predicted a high Friday afternoon in the mid-thirties with the low tonight in the same range. Christmas day, the thermometer is to rise near 40, making for a slushy day. No more snow is immediately in sight.
