Viet War Brings Confusion

PRAGUE (UPI) — The shadow of the Viet Nam war looms large over the policies of East European regimes.

Resentment of American action mingles with fear of eventual involvement if the war should escalate into a major conflagration.

Above all, the Viet Nam war is considered the chief factor preventing a much hoped-for thaw in East-West relations.

The authoritative view here is that the new freeze will continue to block any possible advance towards a profitable resumption of the interrupted East-West dialogue so long as

the Viet Nam conflict continues. The desire for an improvement of relations with the West remains strong and is openly stated on government level.

MOSCOW (UPI)—Premier Alexei Kosygin Tuesday was unanimously re-elected by the Supreme Soviet (parliament) to head the country's government for another four years.

The 1,517 members of the bicameral parliament also unanimously endorsed the policies formulated by Kosygin since he succeeded Nikita S. Khrushchev as premier in October of 1961.

Kosygin had, in effect, been the head of a caretaker government since the new Supreme Soviet was elected June 12 and his mandate expired.

The unanimous vote for the incumbent premier surprised because no one in the Soviet capital announced that he would not be re-elected.

Chicago, Austin Deaths Linked

ALLENSTOWN, Pa. (UPI)—"There'll be some more like the massacre on the University of Texas campus was 'definitely connected' with the mass murders of eight student nurses in Chicago last month, a noted psychiatrist contended today.

And, through some strange quirk in the workings of the criminally insane mind, more mass killings can be expected, according to Dr. Frederick Wertham, one of the world's foremost authorities on criminal violence.

A second expert, however, maintained it is "conceivable but very, very unlikely" that the Chicago murders triggered the violence in Texas.

Dr. Philip Solomon, chief of psychiatry services at Boston City Hospital, continued: "What triggers people to do this is their own psychosis, their own crazy mentality that is suddenly blown up by whatever it is that is disturbing them."

Yet, he added, "someone on the very edge could be tipped by almost anything that might happen and somehow stir his psychological impulses."

Saying he was convinced the slayings in Austin were "definitely connected" with the Chicago murders "of eight nurses only 17 days before, Wertham maintained."

McLain Back on Winning Track for Tigers

Dennis McLain was beginning to wonder what was wrong — and then the phone rang. The Detroit righthander had been having his problems since the all-star game where he impressed by retiring the first nine National League batters. Denny was 13-4 at that time, but fell apart immediately after the mid-season break and lost his next four decisions. The pieces were placed back together Tuesday night as McLain regained his winning form with a four-hit, 5-0 win over Chicago and the credit goes to Charlie Dressen, who is recuperating from a heart attack suffered May 16. Dressen watches the Tigers from his hotel room whenever the games are televised and is in constant touch with the coaching staff. Tuesday afternoon, McLain was broiling steaks in his backyard when his wife Alice, daughter of former major league manager Lou Boudreau, burst from the house to inform Dennis that he was wanted on the telephone — by Dressen.

"The guy really helped me," McLain said after hurling his fourth shutout of the season. "We spoke for about 20 minutes and he told me what I was doing wrong. "He said, 'you'd better stop throwing that curve ball of yours. You've got a good one

but you'd better not use it so much." "I threw 143 pitches tonight," the 22-year-old hurler added. "and I bet 130 were fast balls. I didn't throw more than 14 or 15 curves."

McLain was nearly invincible over the first half of the season. Included in his 13 wins were two one-hitters, two two-hitters and a pair of four-hitters. His third four-hitter of the campaign was another fine showing as the Chicago native walked only two and allowed White Sox singles in the fourth, fifth, seventh and ninth innings.
