In proposing the reorganization, Johnson said "federal coordination of transportation systems assistance is more difficult than it need be."

Although the Department of Transportation will have full authority to fund grants to urban areas it will not be permitted to do so unless the proposal for a grant conforms with the overall plan for the specific urban area involved. The current spending level for the program is \$140 million. The




