Groom Hospital Changes Policy

GROOM (Spl) - A change of policy has been adopted by Groom Memorial Hospital here. It will become effective March 1, according to an announcement by the board of directors. Pointing out that the hospital receives no tax funds and no foundation or endowment funds. The directors state the hospital must operate entirely from fees received for services to patients.

In the future, according to the new policy, no patient will be admitted without a cash deposit and no patient will be dismissed until all financial arrangements have been made. Emergency patients will be admitted but not dismissed until satisfactory financial arrangements have been made.

Reliable insurance policies will be accepted on account to the extent to which they will pay.

Mock Trial Of

TOKYO (UPI)-One-thousand Communists Open By NICHOLAS DANILOFF

WASHINGTON (UPI)- A attracting birds. "I want togive mock trial of international Communism opened Monday, with an "indictment" charging Comcrimes against humanity. The Communist movement

was accused of fomenting subversion, promoting slave labor and suppression of freedom of speech and religion. The trial is being conducted

at Georgetown University under sponsorship of the so-called World Court of Public opinion. The aim is to acquaint young persons in particular with the nature of the Communist movement, and to counter pro-Soviet propaganda stemming from the 50th anniversary last year on the Bolshevik Revolu-

The court is composed of a five-man tribunal representing world's various legal bring to light the nature of the communist world and will not render a formal verdict of innocent or guilty.

The indictment, a copy of which was served on the Soviet Embassy in Washington, was read by a clerk before an audience of about 50 spectators. Since neither the Soviet Union nor the American Communist

party sent a representative to present the defendants' case, the tribunal appointed a 29-yearold criminal lawyer to handle the defense. C. Dickerman Williams of New York is acting

as chief prosecutor.

The young defense attorney,
Leonard Joseph Keilp, 29, of
Washington, said he would make a number of procedural objections, among them the five-judge tribunal hearing the case may be incompetent. He claimed some of the judges are too anti-Communist to make a fair judgment.

A leadoff witness for the prosecution was Eugene Lyons, a senior editor of the Reader's Digest and a onetime Moscow correspondent. In his recent book on Russia, Lyons charged Communist there is supported by a vast informing apparatus, that children are brainwashed from an early age, and the dignity of man is all too often insulted and violated.



Governors Make Plans on Hearings

WASHINGTON Republican governors today announced plans for a series of 1968 GOP platform hearings. But their chairman said there still was no assurance they will win a co-leadership role in drafting the document at the party's national convention.

Gov. John H. Chafee of Rhode Island, chairman of the Republican Governors' Association, announced the five hearings around the country, starting in late April.

He told a news conference he has received neither "unassurance nor assurance" from Republican National Chairman Ray C. Bliss that the governors will be granted a co-chairmanship of the platform-writing committee. That decision is to be made here later this week.

Chafee affirmed that the governors deliberately avoided Democratic-controlled states as limited to domestic issues, steering clear of Vietnam and foreign policy in general.

Chafee, a Romney-for-president man, said he thought the Republican governors would have a candidate to back for the GOP presidential nomination by their June meeting in



Lt. James R. Gilmore of the Police Department's special services division described modern gypsies Monday in 10 words:

"They ride around in Cadillacs and make money telling fortunes."

Gilmore is well acquainted with gypsies because when he gets word that a fortune teller is operating, he has to send a man around to pretend that he wants his fortune told.

Uusually, the fortune teller turns out to be a gypsy woman who dresses during business hours, as a gypsy woman is supposed to dress-long dress, earrings and shawl.

If she tells a policeman's fortune, he arrests her on vagrancy charges. It is unlawful in Texas to accept money for trying to predict the future.

When police in Dallas arrest gypsies, they frequently take them before Justice of the Peace W. E. (Bill) Richburg, a salty man known informally as the "law west of the Trinity."
