

The county agent said that county-wide damage from rust was not expected to be serious. "There is no question but that rust has caused some damage. but the wheat is so far along

that it will be very minor." Damage from the disease "Take All" (or foot-rot, as it is sometimes called) was also expected to be relatively light, Whaley said.

Most dryland farmers "could not be happier with the weather," the county agent said, but many irrigation farmers were very anxious because it is past time to get thier mile and sorghum planted."

For those wheat farmers bothered by excessive weeds, the county agent recommended immediate aerial spraying.

# First Steps Are Taken For Proposed Civic Center the approximately \$1-million

New formative steps for a proposed civic center in Pampa to be known as the M. K. Brown Memorial Auditorium were authorized at a meeting yesterday afternoon of the general auditorium committee with architect George H. Dahl of Dallas and William Jarrel Smith, trustee of the M. K. Brown Foundation.

On a motion by Gordon Lyons, the general committee requested the executive board headed by E. L. Green Jr. to work out the type of structure and plans for financing the approximately \$1 million project with the aid of funds from the Foundation.

Smith, speaking for the Foundation told the committee members that the M.K. Brown Estate had been closed and that residue of the estate available to produce income for a civic center included \$300,000 in stock \$200,000 in mineral interests and approximately \$100,000 in surface lands plus \$200,000 in cash that the Foundation has saved.

As soon as the committee comes up with specific plans. Smith stated, the Foundation is ready to cooperate in any way it can to get the project start-

"We would certainly want the result to be something that will be a credit to the memory of Mr. Brown," Smith said. · Architect Dahl urged the committee to figure out available financing and then "arrive at something that will stir the imagination and establish a civic

image for Pampa." You need something to make your citizens proud," Dahl said. Dahr agreed to present preliminary sketches, drawings, costs, etc., on what type of structure could be expected for

# Television In Review

By RICK DU BROW HOLLYWOOD (UPI)-Like a nightmare, the shooting of Sen. Robert Kennedy early today in Los Angeles was reported live to televiewers who had stayed up late watching Tuesday's coverage of the California primaries.

It was the middle of the night for most of the nation-shortly after midnight, Pacific timewhen the horrible sight of the aftermath was suddenly seen by those who had just watched Kennedy make a victory statement following the presidential primary.

Kennedy had just left the podium in the ballroom of the Ambassador Hotel and was headed elsewhere when the televiewer suddenly saw a wild, panicky rush of photographa- Channel 16 phers and other observers to a place off-camera. There were wails and screams of anguish by men and women as pandemonium broke loose, and pandemonium broke loose, and people rushed to microphones to beg for a doctor.

And as all three networks focused on the tragic scene, the sickening memory of other shootings of public figuresincluding Kennedy's brother, the late president-came back to televiewers who had participated dramatically in the afterreported on the home screen.

First there had been the killing of John F. Kennedy himself, and then of his alleged Army Organization of Algeria assassin, Lee Harvey Oswaldwhere the president had been against independent groups. shot.

And only recently, one watched on television as the asssassination of the Rev. Martin Luther King in Memphis was reported, and as the massive funeral was covered while the killer, still on the loose, was being sought.

As reports on Sen. Kennedy's condition came in on television. there were haunting parallels in one's memory-for just as his brother had been shot in the head, so the senator also suffered a wound there.

Viewers tuning in late to the events of early today were kept informed of the dreadful immediate aftermath by reruns of videotape. There also were eyewitnesses. And one report had it that when Kennedy was shot, and was on the ground in shock with crowds milling around him, he looked up and said: "Is everybody safe?"

There was the report of a suspect being seized. And then, as the initial shock began to wear off slightly, one remembered how only minutes before Kennedy had been happy, buyoant and energetic in his nationally televised victory statement, discussing serious issues but also joking with wellwishers. And one suddenly was depressed beyond words.
