# Drysdale Hurls 6th Straight Shutout

Don Drysdale didn't need any help from Harry Wendelstedt this time but he got quite an assist from Paul Popovich.

Drysdale set a major league record Tuesday night by pitching his sixth straight shutout and set a National League mark by stretching his streak of consecutive scoreless innings to 54. He's only two shy of the major league mark of 56 set by Walter Johnson in 1913.

The big righthander accomplished all this by tossing a three-hit shutout at the Pittsburgh Pirates while pitching the Los Angeles Dodgers to a 5-0 victory.

Behind the plate again was umpire Harry Wendelstedt but this time he wasn't involved in a controversy. It was Wendelstedt who made the decision last Friday night that preserved the streak when he called back San Francisco's Dick Dietz for not trying to avoid the pitch after Drysdale hit him with the

bases loaded in the ninth inning. Aid from Popovich

But Popovich was invaluable as he made several sparkling plays. The biggest came with two out in the sixth with Maury Wills hit a slow roller with Gary Kolb on third base. Popovich charged the ball and flipped to first to just hip the dashing Wills.

Popovich also went behind the bag at second to scoop up Roberto Clemente's hard grounder and he tossed out Willie Stargell for the last out of the

game after Wills singled with two out in the ninth.

Drysdale, whose sixth shutout broke the mark of five straight set by Doc White in 1904, will go for Johnson's record of 56 innings on Saturday night against the Phillies.

Elsewhere in the National League, Philadelphia topped San Francisco 5-1, St. Louis nipped Houston 3-2, Cincinnati topped Atlanta 3-1 and New York blanked Chicago 5-0.

Senators Top Oakland In the American League,

Cleveland topped Chicago 2-1, Washington beat Oakland 4-2, Minnesota blanked New York 3-0, California beat Baltimore 5-3 in 10 innings and Detroit and Boston split a doubleheader by identical 2-0 scores.

The streaking St. Louis Cardinals chalked up their seventh straight victory by downing Houston. Julian Javier singled in the deciding run with two out in the ninth. Steve Carlton, with relief help in the ninth, got the win.

Rookie Jerry Koonsman be-

came the majors second nine-game winner as he pitched an eight-hit shutout to lift New York past Chicago.

Larry Jackson pitched a four hitter and John Callison hit a two-run homer in the first as Philadelphia topped San Francisco.

Tony Perez singled home the tie-breaking run in a two-run sixth inning to give the Reds triumph over the Braves. Gerry Arrigo went 8 2-3 innings to get the win.

**Crisis In Italy**

It was an ironic fact that as Italy observed its 22nd anniversary as a republic in the midst of a new wave of prosperity, it also was facing another of its recurring political crises.

It further was torn by new student demonstrations which in the last eight months have brought periods of paralysis to the Italian university system.  
The government crisis came as result of a decision by the Unified Socialists led by Deputy Premier Pietro Nenni to withdraw from their six-year-old alliance with the dominant Christian Democrats of Premier Aldo Moro.

**Social Reforms**  
The Socialists blamed their election losses last month on their coalition with the Christian Democrats, a coalition in which they have been the junior partners, and on failure of the center-left to press vigorously enough for social and economic reforms.

The Socialist action seems to foreshadow another long period of crisis for the Italian government.  
In theory, it should be possible for the Christian Democrats, Italy's leading party since the end of World War

I, to form a coalition with parties of the far right, the neo-Fascists, the Monarchists and Liberals, and achieve the necessary 316 majority in the chamber of deputies.  
But the last such government, in 1960, fell to bloody Communist riots and even the hard-core conservatives among the Christian Democrats would shy from any such similar experience again.

On the other hand, the Unified Socialists lost their votes in the May elections to the Communists and to the splinter Proletarian Socialists.  
**Price High**  
Their price now for continued association with the Christian Democrats will be high and perhaps impossible to meet since among the latter are many who would rather see a government fall than to go any further to the left.

For most Italian political pundits, the Communist gains came as a surprise because of Italy's new wealth.  
But the wealth is unevenly distributed and the swing to the left, particularly among Italy's young voters, is attributed to this and to the long delay in solving social problems.  
Student unrest sprang from dissatisfaction with an antiquat-

support gave him more power than contained in his largely ceremonial office as vice president.  
Ky has been involved in a long and sometimes privately caustic feud over policy matters with President Nguyen Van Thieu.  
Some of the more important Ky men who have fallen in the battle of Saigon were Col. Luu Kim Cuong, commander of Tan Son Nhut Air Base, and Col. Dam Van Quy, deputy director of the National Police.  
The director of the National Police, Brig. Gen. Nguyen Ngoc Loan, lies wounded in a Saigon hospital, recovering from wounds he suffered in leading troops into a Viet Cong stronghold.  
Among those killed Sunday in the rocket attack were four Ky men, including the chief of the Cholon district police in Saigon and the director of the port of Saigon.

**CYPRUS TALKS**  
BEIRUT, Lebanon (UPI)—Preliminary talks to try to end 4½ years of strife between Greeks and Turks on the island of Cyprus got under way Monday and the Greek representative, Glafkos Clerides, said he hoped regular negotiations could start on Cyprus in three weeks.
