SOCIAL SECURITY FOR CHILDREN

One of the longest forward steps taken by the American government has been the provision of social security for children who, without such aid, would most likely be condemned to miserable years of childhood and be likely to graduate into miserable youths and adults.

In an effort to better the condition of such children, Congress extended its general social security legislation to bring aid and welfare to these young, in cooperation with the States in which they live.

The first three categories come under the administration of the Child's Bureau and the fourth directly under the Social Security Board which was created to administer the laws for the benefit and protection of indigent adults.

There are in this country a large number of persons who at times are unemployed and at other times work for such low wages that they can not afford adequate care for their offspring.

The general plans for old age pensions, unemployment insurance, and such measures of social security ultimately will go far toward caring for the aged, the indigent, the unemployed, and will lighten the burdens now resting so heavily on many of the people.

In cities there have long been free clinics where advice has been obtainable and, in some respects, the situation is not so bad there.

Mothers will be given care and advice before the birth of infants and instruction in proper feeding and early care of their children.

The rapid response in setting the child security machinery in motion is regarded as especially noteworthy.

DAILY WASHINGTON LETTER

WASHINGTON—Democratic leaders are thinly masking their apprehension over the warnings of a possible labor war growing out of John L. Lewis' drive to organize steel workers.

Lewis has allied himself with the Roosevelt administration, carrying with him the support of the United Mine Workers and other labor groups.

Indorsement of the Roosevelt administration by Lewis and his followers last winter was welcomed at the time. But if their organizing drive in the steel industry should bring on a strike, that might present a different situation.

Lewis has explained that he is proceeding under terms of the Wagner labor act which gives labor the right to organize.

But what if a strike on a wide front should grow out of the organization movement? Many New Deal leaders are questioning whether the support of Mr. Lewis' organization would be a blessing.

Such a situation would confront the New Deal with a real dilemma—whether to back industry and lose the good will of Lewis and his followers, or to back Lewis and antagonize industry.

Through the American Iron and Steel Institute and through its own officials, the industry has insisted it would not tolerate "paid organizers" of outside unions.

The Japanese "spy" investigation in Los Angeles has received husky headlines, but the incident apparently hasn't upset the navy department.

Three high ranking naval officials testified a year ago before the senate munitions investigating committee that information about new naval inventions, new battle formations or anything else new in the navy was in the hands of foreign naval officials soon enough to prevent anybody being surprised.

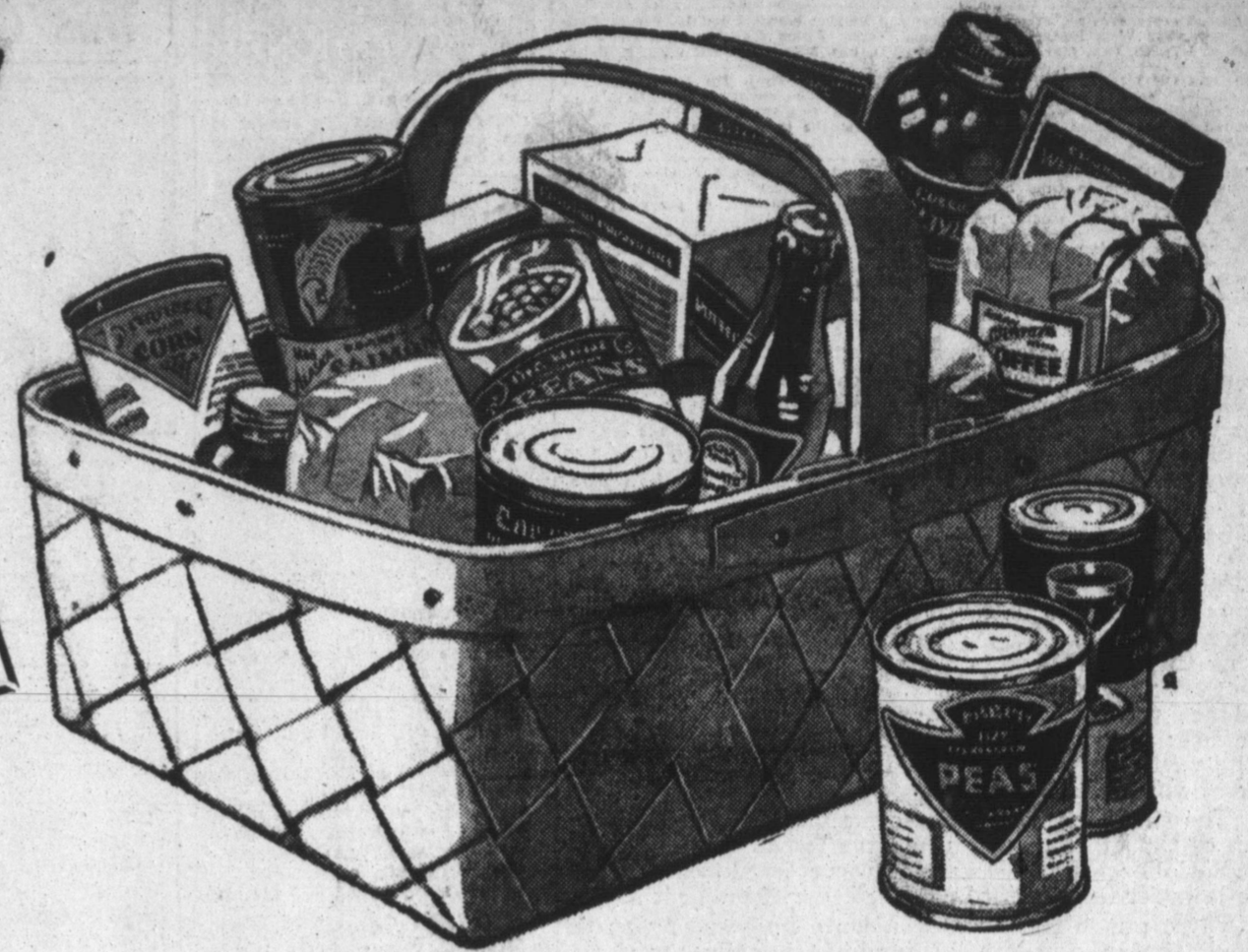
