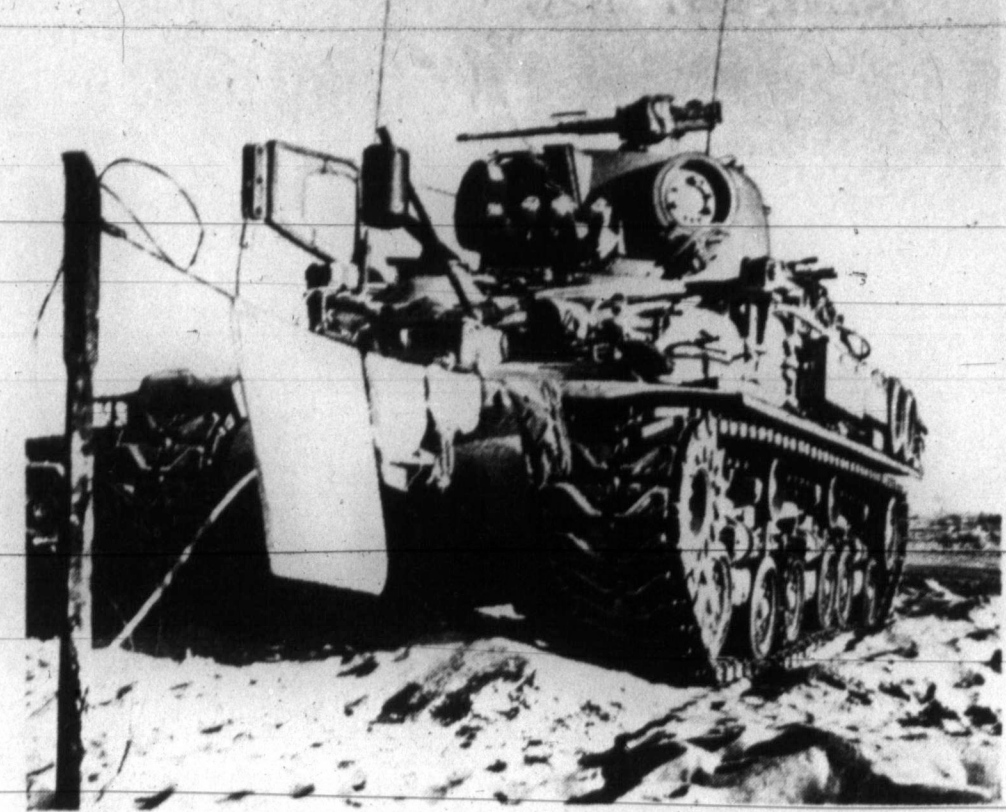

ROME (UPI) — Police disclosed plans today to call in scientists to help identify the background of photographs purportedly showing the mutilated grandson of American billionaire J. Paul Getty.

Communists Shoot Rockets Into Base

SAIGON (UPI) — Communist troops fired 25 Soviet-made rockets into the Pleiku air base in the Central Highlands late today, the second rocket attack against a government air base this month, military sources said.

In Cambodia, government troops launched major attacks early today against insurgent positions around a 12-mile stretch of strategic Highway 4 in an attempt to break a two-week rebel hold on the road.

Wounding 100 government soldiers. Saigon's military command today issued an immediate denial of the Viet Cong charges, saying the attack in the Mekong Delta never took place.

The command said Communist troops violated in South Vietnam totaled 115 for the 24 hours ending at sunrise today, the highest figure in a month.

Robert Vesco Seeking Motion For Dismissal

NASSAU, Bahamas (UPI) — Attorneys for Robert L. Vesco worked today on a motion for dismissal to be presented at a Bahamian hearing into a U.S. request for extradition of the financier.

The United States is attempting to extradite Vesco, 38, on charges he embezzled \$50,000 from the International Controls Corp., one of many companies he controlled.

TANKS PULL OUT Greece Relaxes Curfew Period

ATHENS (UPI) — The Greek government today relaxed a nighttime curfew in Athens, and army tanks pulled out of the city in a move to heal the scars left by a three-day student rebellion.
