Texas. Mr. Stinnett appeared before the committee last week while in Washington in the interest of the Rock Island North Plains line. Tentative plans in the irrigation pact call for three, and possibly

four, dams on the river north of Amarillo.

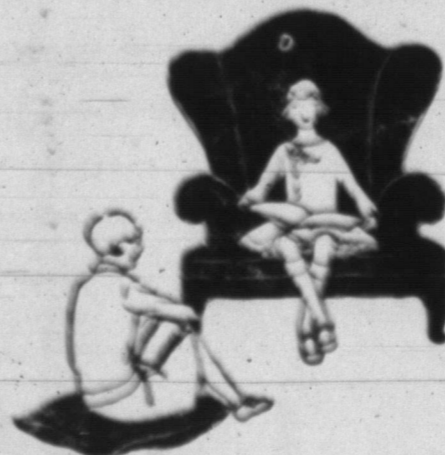

LUTHER BURBANK

Luther Burbank, noted plant expert, is dead. His achievements in the field of plant life will make him known in history as one of the most beneficial Americans.

Just a few months before he died, Burbank started a fight when he doubted the value of religion. His statements were so cutting that they were interpreted as meaning that he did not believe in a Supreme Being.

Burbank lost considerable popularity at the time, but it is sure that he will be remembered for his discoveries in plant life and not for his religious views.

It is regrettable that a man can be so brilliant in one line and so unbalanced in another field. Burbank's request that Judge Ben B. Lindsey of Denver read an oration of Robert G. Ingersoll, the one delivered at his brother's funeral in 1879, at his own funeral will also add to his unpopularity among those who hold religious views sacred.

A CLEAN CITY

A clean city is essential for health and beauty. No city can ever obtain the wholesome publicity it deserves if filth is stalking around nearly every block.

Paving will help a city, but even paving must be kept clean. Several cities in the Panhandle do not sweep their paving as a result they receive much adverse criticism from visitors and residents.

Most Pampa people can keep their premises clean. Clean residences and clean business firms will be noticeable. If Pampa will have a reputation for being one of the cleanest cities of the Panhandle, you need not fear about people wanting to live here. People flock to communities that have good living conditions.

A TOWN'S GOOD NAME.

Towns have reputations, they have names, good or bad, and they can be slandered or given good repute, just as with people.

Several years ago, the city of Chicago went into court asking damages for the besmirching of her fair name and within the past month Bay City, Michigan, has been plaintiff in a similar action against two Saginaw men who, in a dispute over a proposed source of water supply for Saginaw, made published statements to the effect that Bay City's water supply was unfit to drink. The Saginaw men have made public retraction of their statements, just as if they had libeled some individual, and now it is probable that the court action against them will be dropped.

The good citizen's reputation is his most important asset. It is his card on entrance among groups of good citizens everywhere. It is his worth more than money in the bank. A town's good name is the town's most valuable possession, worth more than any individual's reputation because it includes all those individuals whose majority action has helped build the town's good name.

People are properly jealous of their town's good name. Gold in the town's treasury may be trash, if lost it can be replaced, but the gold of a town's good name takes years for accumulation and once lost may never be regained.

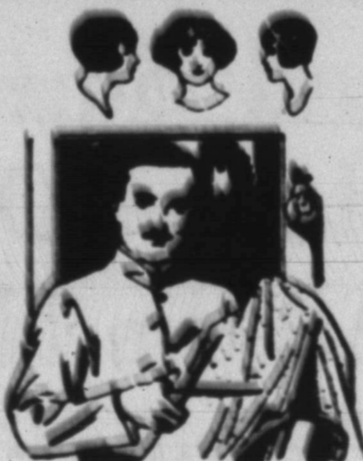

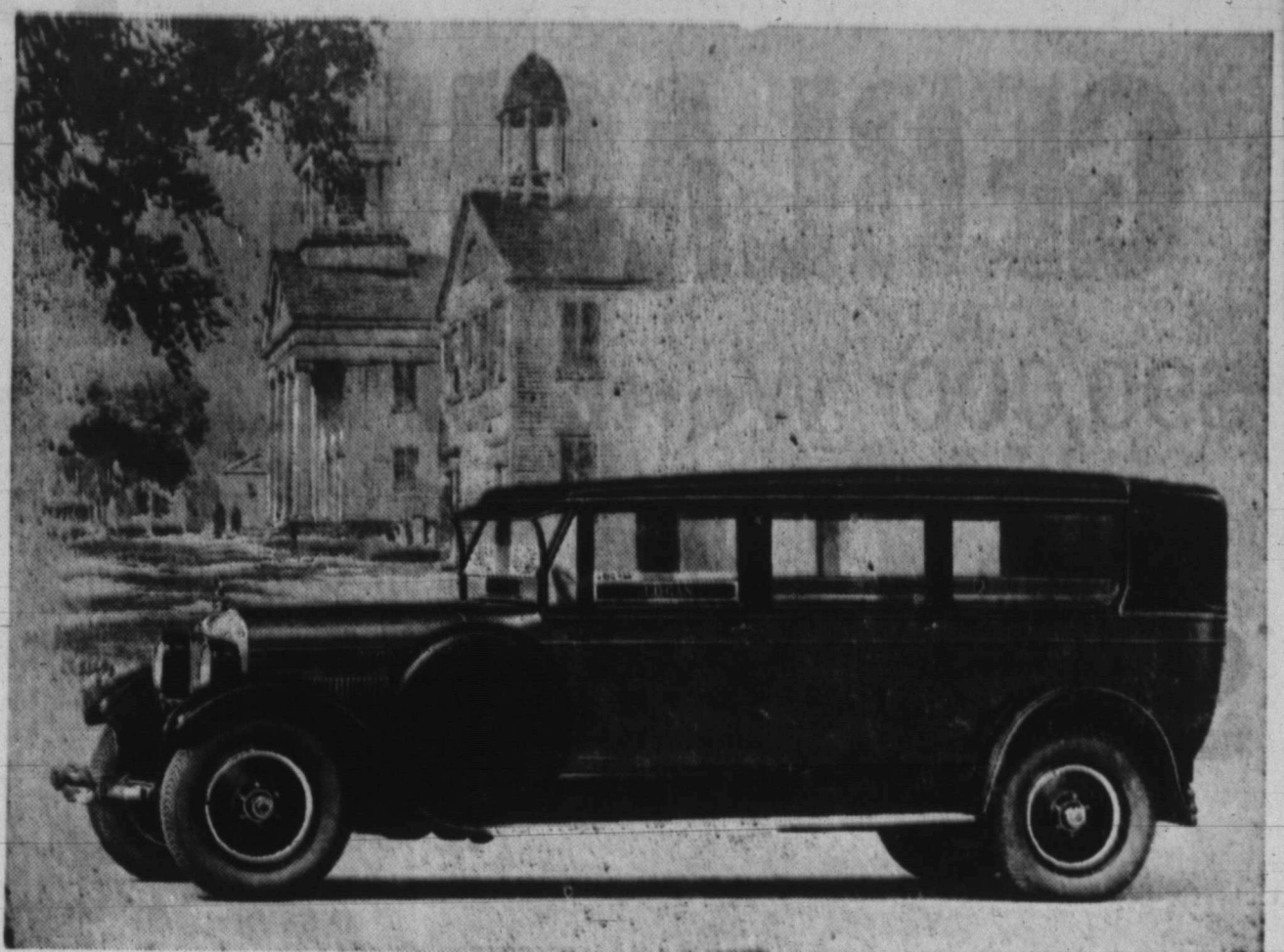
