All Eligible Voters Must
Pay Poll Taxes At Once
The person without a vote is practically the person without a country. Without a vote there is no chance to take part in your own affairs. No pe
to vote unless they have paid a poll tax.

Poll taxes are now payable at the office of Sheriff . S. Graves, and at several of the stores. Persons of voting age must live in the state for at least a year and
in the county for at least six months, and in the precinct in the county for at least six months, and in the precinct they are not eligible unless they have paid a poll tax and have a poll tax receipt.

Every person of voting age is urged to pay a poll tax at once. Elections, both general and "fjecial, are only air when participated in by a majority. When yourself, but to your home city.

Poll taxes must be paid before midnight on January 31. Pay them at the Sheriff's office or at one of the
