### **PUDDINGS AND SAUCES**

COTTAGE pudding is one of the one that is usually well liked. The advantage of a pudding in this form to that what is left over may be served for tea cake.

Cottage Pudding.

Cream two tubiespoonfuls of butter, add one cupful of sugar and when well mixed the yolks of two beaten eggs. Mix one and one-half cupfuls of flour with two teaspoonfuls of baking powder and one-half teaspoonful of calt, Add the dry ingredients with one cupful of milk alternately to the egg and sugar mixture, beat well and pour into a shallow pan. Bake 15 minutes; serve with any desired

Lemon Sauce.

Take one tablespoonful of corn starch or two of flour, one-half cupful of sugar, the grated rind of a lemon, a plack of sait and one cupful of boiling water; after the dry ingredients have been well mixed, add the juice of a lemon and cook, adding two tablespoonfuls of butter and a dash of autmeg just before serving.

Golden Cream Sauce. Seat one egg until light, then add three-fourths of a cupful of sugar. Add one cupful of stiffly whipped cream, and lastly two tablespoonfuls of orange juice and one of lemon. Served on brown betty, this sauce is especially delicious as well as on

Hard Sauce

Cream one-fourth of a cupius or buttor, add one and one-half cupfuls of powdered sugar, the grated rind of half a lemon and two tablespoonfuls of lemon juice. An egg may be added, using more sugar, making a richer cauce. This hard sauce will keep in en. a cold place for a long time.

Many owners of dairy cattle fail to give the good cow sufficient feed above that required for carrying on her bodily functions, says the United States Department of Agriculture. The highly specialized dairy cow returns in the form of milk practically all of the digestible nutrients in the feed given her except those for body maintainance. Nearly all highly spcialize milk producers lose weight in the early part of the lactation period, but the normally regain it toward the end of the milking period. The dairyman can well afford to feed such cows liberally.



Safety Through Pasteurization reteurizing, or heating milk to came a fact withing the following the temperature, kills the bachich sometimes cause disease le-and also the milk to go sour etc. Disease-causing bacteria aren't present in the milk when it comes fresh from the cow-unless the cow herself is diseased. But they get in from other sources such as contaminated water in which the milk utensils are washed. Don't take a chance.

### Proper Pails

Never use galvanized iron pails for milking because the acids in milk act on this metal and they're also hard to clean. Avoid wood and other porous buckets, too, Dairy utensils should always me made of material that is non-absorbant, easily cleaned, and not readily affected by milk. Buckes made of sheet metal, heavily tinned, are satisfactory-but be sure the tinning is always in good condition. Rusty utensels give a bad flavor to milk.

More Work For The Cow The big increase in butter production is explained by increases in population and in per capita consumption. In 1918 the average consumption of butter per person in the United States, was 14 pounds. In 1925 this had increased to 17 pounds. Cheese consumption increased during the same period also from 3 pounds to 4 1-4 pounds per capita, and ice cream fro ma little over two gallons to almot three gallons per individual. There was a large increase in the per capita consumption of milk. It jumped from 43 gallons in 1918 to 54 3-4 gallons in 1925.

THE phrase, "not at home" is moreand accepted without feeling. In opposed the idea. smaller places the phrase "not at. many small-town homes is the case, a child may answer the door, he should he may say, "Mother is not at home to callers today." The mind of a child is literal, and he is not always able to distinguish between what words say and what they mean. If a hostess is Indisposed or engaged, it is better to say so, politely adding that she will be very sorry, and will the caller come again soon.

There is just as much need for observance of social customs in the email town as in the big city, and, indeed, people living in smaller places are often more truly polite, more graclous and considerate than those who live in the cities. The same rules and principles apply to both, and it is quite essential that the mistress of the town or country home acquaint herself and ber family with correct usage.

By persons always accustomed to social phrasings and social ways, this will doubtless seem like being overocrupulous, but mothers with small children have to be overscrupulous in teaching the principles of truth-telling. It would seem that whoever answers the door, if the mistress does not wish to see callers, might give some other politely expressed phrase which would answer quite as well as the "not at home," and at the same time not be open to criticism,

VALUE OF HIDES

**Proper Skinning Nets** More Profit From Animals

Preparatory to skinning farm animals clean the hide as thoroughly as posible, sugests the United States Department of Agriculture. The use of the old-fashioned curry-comb with its sharp, and usually rusty, jagged teeth may result in serious damage particularly to calfskins. A more recent style of comb with dull teeth or a fiber brush and water, preferably fro ma fountai natachment, is much safer.

Always bleed cattle by sticking the throat lengthwise instead of crosswise unless religeous requirements prevent. Cutting the throat crosswise mars the pattern of the hide and lowers the market value. Make the ripping open cuts straight with smooth edges, and in the proper places and directions. If a hide is not opened up correctly it will not be of proper pattern and consequently less valuable for leather. The butt, belly, and shoulder portions of the hide will not properly distributed so that the tanner can not divide the resulting leather according to the quality and value of tended the funeral services of Mrs. these different sections.




