## Pay Your Poll Tax Now And Be **Eligible To Cast Your Ballot**

Only two more days to pay your poll tax only two more days to declare yourself a voting citizen of Pampa. Poll taxes must be paid before midnight, Monday January 31. Only persons who have resided in the state for at least one year, in the county for at least six months and in this precinct for at least thirty daysand have paid a poll tax, can vote.

First Pay Picked Up Between 3112 and 3120 Feet; Second Pay From 3150 To 3160 Feet

The Prairie Oil Company's McConnell number 1 came in yesterday morning for a production of 100 barrels per hour, natural flow. The production had increased this morning to the rate of 3600 barrels a day. The well is located eight miles west and one and one-half miles north of Pampa.

The first pay was picked up at from 3112 to 3120 feet. The second pay was struck at from 3150 to 3160 feet. The elevation at the location of the well is 3225 feet. It is located one mile northwest of the Parks-Noel well that has been making a good production for the past two weeks.

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
